



FROM THE QUARTERDECK

JUNE 2009



In June, the Club embarks on the Junior Program, including Opti-Kids, Junior Week, Laser and Opti Race Teams and Opti Development Team, under the leadership of Jr. Div. Cdr. Jay Buhl, Lt. Cdr. Alison Lennarz, Race Chair James Jacob, and the respective Team Coordinators Mary Buhl, Joe Roos and Ted Steadman, with the assistance of a large crew of parents and volunteers. My personal FBYC launch was made in the Junior Program as a parent, volunteer, boat donor, Communication Officer, Race Committee and Junior Division Commander, and my children have grown out of the program, even if they still wear their tee shirts, so the commencement of the Junior season is always a time of reflection for me.

The program has always been one of the bright running lights of FBYC. Generations of children have grown up in the program and set sail on lives enriched by the experience. The legendary service of Jan Monnier and Kelly O'Toole stands out in any history of the program. Although FBYC Juniors like Gary Hooper, Brent Halsey, Will Crump, Strother and Lina Scott, among others, had raced long before in smaller numbers,

on my watch we stumbled, somewhat naively, more deeply into competitive racing. Remembering my first CBYRA Junior Scheduling Meeting, I recall Ruthanna Jenkins' gasp when I blithely volunteered FBYC to host the 2004 Optimist Atlantic Coast Championships to the skeptical glances from larger Bay clubs with more established programs. But, giving truth to the maxim "be careful what you ask for," we soon got a call from USODA asking if we were serious. With our Board's blessing, we went on to host an acclaimed regional regatta that silenced any doubters. That shortly led to a reprise in the US Sailing Junior Olympics the following year.

Fortuitously for FBYC, our plunge into deep waters was buoyed by the best of circumstances. Through sheer luck we discovered that FBYC's first professional coach, Juan Carlos Romero, was available and we audaciously outbid the competition at leading Maine clubs for his service. Other junior leaders, Eric and Danelle Powers, Steve Wirt and Mike Toms, to name a few, reveled in the luxury of superb professional coaches, from Juan to Alejandro Cloos, Diego Ravecca, Damian Saponara, and Luis Dingo Canuto, each of whom led our Juniors to new horizons. We also had an extraordinary influx of sailing talent, including the Jacob and Swenson children Alex and Erin, Kyle and Kendall, who sprung fully formed onto

the FBYC scene from the neighboring property, and innate talents like Quentin Jenkins, Cori Radke, Madeleine and Graeme Alderman, Austin Powers, Ben and Mary Catherine Buhl, and others. Many of those young talents rose steadily to join the top sailors in the Bay and the nation, as reflected in recent reports in this newsletter and on the FBYC website. The returning Alejandro Cloos and Peter Strong will lead them this year.

While some of our talented juniors will be with us a few more years on the Laser and Opti Race Teams, others have aged out, and more will do so sooner than we like to imagine. But, the seeds of future success will be nurtured this year in the Opti Development Team, and among the fourteen participants of the Racing Opti Class and fifteen members of the Intermediate Opti Class. Ironically, a few junior members of another club are joining our legendary racing program this year, while their club suffers a temporary decline in racing participation. We've come a long way; let us not suffer such declines. Please encourage our entry level sailors to carry on our fine tradition.

Meeting called to order at 6:05 p.m. by Commodore Noel Clinard.

REAR COMMODORE – DAVID S. HINCKLE

TREASURER – Chip Hall presented the Treasurer’s Report and reported that even though dues and initiation fee payments are down some from last year for this time period, budgeted expenses are under control with the exception of the water system and our debt balance is down significantly. Chip advised that the club has experienced some check and bank draft returns due to insufficient funds. Upon motion duly made and seconded, the Board adopted a policy whereby the member will be required to reimburse the club the amount charged by the bank for any check or bank draft returned for insufficient funds.

HOUSE – The ice maker in the main clubhouse has been repaired, Plexiglas panels have been added over the barn windows in the locker section, and pool equipment has been reconnected in the pump house. Members are asked to use the exhaust fans in the east bath house when showering. The timer switch is located on the wall beside the shower. The water situation has improved with the help of a new softener and the sand filter placed inline before our r/o system. Ken Odell is also reviewing information and pricing of some leak detection devices.

SOCIAL – Michael Calkins reported that approximately 150 adults and 15 children attended the Opening Day dinner/dance and the event came in under budget.

WEB – Strother Scott reported that the web site seems to be working fine with very limited problems with online registration. He asked the Flag and Event managers to be more attentive to entering the

volunteer names into the system. The names are being entered for some events but not for others. Strother is researching why the email reminders to the Event Chairs that usually go out on Tuesdays have not been sent in 2009. The Crew Finder at <http://www.fbyc.net/Sailing/Crew> has finally been modernized and the public at large can now add their data. We have a “captcha” like feature that prevents computer robots from adding data to this page.

HISTORIAN – Jere Dennison has ordered the Donor Plaque through Acorn Signs and delivery is expected in the next few weeks. He and Chip Hall met with Steve Gillispie to discuss methods for mounting the plaque on a mahogany-framed backboard that Chip has offered to build for the club.

OPERATIONS MANAGER – The pool building is ready and the pool should open on time.

VICE COMMODORE – C. MAYO TABB, JR.

OFFSHORE DIVISION – Alex Alvis reported that 28 boats participated in the Offshore Spring Series. Plans for the long distance race to Urbanna are underway and there will be races at RRYC on May 24.

CRUISING DIVISION – Ed O’Connor reported that the first cruise of the season is the Mathews Yacht Club Cruise on May 16-17. There will be a cruise to Urbanna on May 23 as well as the After Rosegill Cruise to Yankee Point Yacht Club on May 24-25.

JUNIOR DIVISION – Jay Buhl reported that registration for Junior Program events are ahead of last year and the Junior Division will charter at least four Optis from Norfolk Yacht & Country Club to service the increased demand in Beginning and Intermediate Opti

classes. The demand comes from non-members who are willing to pay higher Junior Week tuition and the charter fee. Coaches Alejandro Cloos and Peter Strong will arrive on Wednesday, June 10. Laser and Opti Race Team practices begin on June 13. There is a new waterproof bulletin board on the junior shed and a new junior sign. Jay reported on new revenue streams to the program, which include increased numbers for team registration, the sale of Junior Sailing apparel and increased OptiKid registrations. New expenses to the program include marketing/communications, the purchase of a Laser trailer, and padding for existing trailers. All expenses are expected to be recouped.

NEW BUSINESS – Strother Scott asked that the club attempt to better control overflow parking on the Richardson’s property. Strother was told by his lawn contractor that one of his best new trees had been pushed over by a car that apparently had been driven across his land instead of using the road when exiting the Richardson overflow parking last fall.

The Flag Officers have conferred about the Leukemia Cup Regatta that the club has hosted or co-hosted for many years and their recommendation is that the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society be respectfully informed that FBYC would be able to support only the sailing activities of the regatta in 2010 while meeting the other requirements of its mission to support the sport of sailing. After a long discussion by Board members, the following Motion was presented and approved by the Board:

It is so **MOVED** that the Board of Trustees of Fishing Bay Yacht Club shall make a determination in advance of each year pertaining to the level of the club’s support

and participation in any regattas and related events, including those of the Leukemia Cup Regatta, and will so

authorize the Flag Officers to notify the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society of the decision for the next year.

There being no additional business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:05 p.m.

FBYC JUNIOR SAILING PROGRAM

Soggy, Foggy Conditions Prevail at the Opti Team Trials

The nation's top Opti sailors gathered early May in Darien, CT for the 2009 Team Trials hosted by Noroton Yacht Club. FBYC was represented with seven of the 211 competitors in this qualifying event. The race committee held 12 races over four days on Long Island Sound; the Opti sailors' equivalent to a grueling marathon. Competitors encountered challenging conditions, from shifty breeze ranging from 4-14 knots, strong spring tides, water temps at 50 degrees, and maximum air temperature in the low-60's.

Alex Jacob, who had not been in an for Opti six months, offered, "I took a break from high school 420 sailing to attend the Team Trials. My hope was that my daily practice in 20-25 knots of wind on Buzzard's Bay would help me excel in potentially brisk spring breezes," continued Alex. "Unfortunately, my weight exploded after wrestling season to 117 pounds and the wind never allowed me to sit on the rail."

Despite the challenging conditions, Alex and fellow FBYC race team sailor Kendall Swenson, posted three top 10 finishes in the 12 race series. And, one of Kendall Swenson's finishes included a bullet. "I was so excited when I heard that horn!" exclaimed Kendall. Having had a disappointing Team Trials performance last year in Annapolis, Kendall was determined to do better this year and exceeded her [and her parent's] expectations by finishing 20th in the regatta. She qualified for the national team as a result and will represent the United States at the IODA North American Championships in the Dominican Republic in July.

Alex Jacob went into Team Trials with the goal to make the IODA World team (the top five finishers). "Despite not meeting my goal, I am pleased with my 30th place finish," said Alex. "It was a nice way to finish my Opti career." [Editor's note: We agree!]

Other sailors from FBYC's Junior Race Team -- Graeme Alderman, Alexander Hanna, Erin Jacob, Conrad Roos, and Eric Roos -- expressed some disappointment in their results but that didn't deter them from making new friends, having fun, learning a lot, and creating many fond memories along the way. A couple even slipped in a side trip to New York City.

While some of the FBYC sailors didn't meet their personal goals at the regatta, they're looking for ways to improve in the future. The FBYC Jr. Week, practice schedule, summer regatta circuit, and coaching by Peter Strong will give them many opportunities to do just that. We're proud of all our FBYC junior sailors.

FBYC Sailor Selected to Compete at Youth Champs

The U.S. Youth Sailing Championships, started in 1973, showcases the nation's top junior competitors in the Laser, Laser Radial, Club 420, and 29er classes. Invitations to the Youth Champs are made by US Sailing's Youth Championship Selection Committee, based on the review of the applicant's entry forms. Kyle Swenson was selected this year to compete against 20 other Laser Radial sailors across the U.S. He will join five other Chesapeake Bay skippers who were selected from the Laser Full Rig and Club 420 classes to compete June 25-30 at Indian Harbor Yacht Club in Greenwich, CT.

While many Youth Championship graduates have gone on to lead successful college sailing programs and filled out the ranks of All-Americans, the event has stayed true to its goals:

- Provide a challenge to young sailors to grow beyond the skill levels used to win at the local and regional level
- Serve as a bridge between Junior Sailing and College Sailing
- Produce U.S. sailors capable of winning the World Youth Championships in big-fleet races
- Develop and identify talent for the U.S. Olympic Sailing Team
- Motivate a lifetime commitment to sailing.
