MINUTES / CLOSING DAY

Parker Garrett is working on RIB replacements with a transitioning of the junior fleet. Further discussions in next month's meeting on what this will look like for the future and how this will fit in.

OLD BUSINESS: Commodore Joseph Roos presented an update on proposed amendments to the Bylaws. The objectives of the proposed changes are to:

- Simplify and clarify Board responsibilities
- Balance ongoing daily Club operation and strategic planning
- Support seamless continuity across normal Board turnover

The board reviewed the modifications to bylaws supporting the proposed Board Structure and primary responsibilities. These included highlighting strategic planning responsibilities of the Flag. The Trustees descriptions were amended to address strategic planning for their areas of responsibilities as well as the Trustees role in recommending Coordinators and Chairs to support their teams and succession planning for their positions. Descriptions of Coordinators and Chair positions were amended to reflect the team structure and encourage broader participation in the Club operation and activities.

The Board was asked to provide any additional edits or comments by Thursday September 15th. The amended bylaws will be proofed and provided for the Board's review prior to the October Board meeting. The final discussion and a vote adopting the amended bylaws is planned for the October Board meeting.

The Trophy Committee will receive nominations until October 15th for the following perpetual trophies to be awarded for this year's Annual Awards:

REQUIESCAT IN PACE



Hello one design racers. It's a waning summer but there are still one design races left. Mark your calendar for One Design #4 on October 9th and hopefully, the ILCA Masters Championship will be rescheduled for later this year (postponed due to Hurricane Ian).

One of the many things I love about sailing and racing is that you are always learning lessons. Sometimes over and over again. Recent racing at the Fall Series #2, for example, taught us several:

- Don't rely exclusively on the forecast. The view from the deck is just as important.
- Switch up your crew and helm positions – it's important to understand the other positions' perspective and skills
- Continually adjust your sail's shape to control vang, outhaul and cunningham as the wind velocity changes.

Don't always believe the weather forecast. Last Saturday started with 2-4 kt winds, very light and variable from the N-E. We left the dock anyway and it gradually built and shifted right all day. 5 Scots and 3 Melges eventually came out. The winds built nicely and by the 4th race, it was 9-11 kt, ideal conditions!

We did 5 races all totaled, on great race courses that were set and continually adjusted by the stellar Race Committee, led by David and Cathy Clark including: Mike Dale, Peter Dutnell, Alex and Donna Alvis, David and Veronica Hinkle, Ellis Hubbard, James Strudy and Judy Miller.

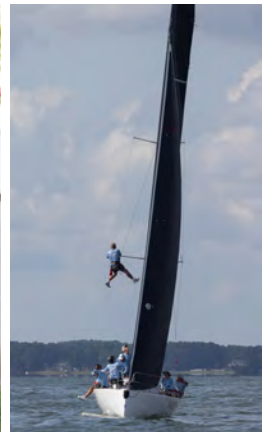

This “score your own time” event was attended by 27 boats and about 80 people. Many families this year with ages ranging from 1 to 70+. The event was won by Corryvreckan (David Clark) in just under 5 hours. David was our first second time winner for this event. 7 boats were able to sail the whole way on Friday. The other 20 boats arrived between Thursday and Saturday, having succumbed to the Iron Lung.



Approximately 17:30pm, on Saturday, a social event was held on the T-head. Each boat brought food to share and a bottle of scotch for tasting. You voted for your favorite by depositing a coin in a cup in front of the bottle. 3 votes per person. After 27 samplings of scotch, votes were tallied and Kilchoman Machir Bay won, a relatively new distillery. Although predicted, no one fell in the water. The town of Cape Charles was fully open with many meals to offer.
