The Scoop on Junior Week 2000

(repeated from March Log!)

Junior Week is going to look a LOT different this year! We'll still have sailing, parties, and fun with friends—but here's the new stuff!

1. OptiKids (sailors age 6-8) is going to be held separately from Junior Week. We started with 12 OptiKids in 1995; last year, we had 32 awesome young sailors... now that's growth! We've decided to move OptiKids to the 2 weekends PRIOR to Junior Week. Mark your calendars for these 4 days June 10, 11, 17 and 18. The class will still be half days, and students will attend classes on all 4 days.

2. Advanced Sailing Class (sailors age 11 and over; or who have completed Intermediate Sailing Class) replaces the Cruising Class.

We were thrilled with the response to this class by so many great sailors last summer, but we heard you really liked the 420s more than the big boats! We're listening!! We could still have a big boat cruise option, but we're going to focus on 420s and we're working to borrow Mobjacks (you know, the cool, sleek boat with a trapeze for those who really like to "hang out"). We'll spend time sailing with our friends and try new stuff as a team. Tell your FBYC friends to meet you in the Advanced Sailing Class!

3. Beginning Opti, Intermediate Opti and Racing Classes are too good to change!

Beginning Opti (sailors age 9 or 10) You'll be sailing that Opti like a pro—with the help of a friend. Two kids in each boat will learn basic sailing skills while having FUN!

Intermediate Opti (sailors age 10 or 11) You've already learned the basics in the Beginning Opti Class last year. Now you're going to sail alone! You'll have lots of fun and learn a little more about getting the boat their first!

Racing Classes (sailors age 11 or over) You've completed Intermediate. You know how to get that boat going, but you want to get there faster! Bring your Opti, Byte, or Laser and learn from some of the best in your class. Maybe you'll join the FBYC Racing Team (you get your own T-shirt ☺) and have fun racing with other kids your age at our club, or at other clubs around the Chesapeake Bay.

Offshore Division Adds Events

While planning the Offshore Division events this winter, the sailing events committee received many comments and suggestions about the type of racing our members prefer. As the deadline for the Red Book's printing approached, we decided to conduct a survey of the Offshore Division yacht owners to determine if there was a consensus for change. We were pleased that a large number of the active offshore racers responded.

The consistent theme in the responses was that most owners of Offshore Division yachts would like to race more days and race more, shorter races. They would also like the race courses set closer to Jackson Creek whenever possible and there was even some sentiment to consider racing inside Fishing Bay when conditions on the Bay get really bad.

For the racers who desire more days of competition at the club, several schedule changes were made in this year's calendar. Opening Day will now be a two-day series in April with the Spring Series following on three days in May. In July and August there will be two "Level Racing" days where no handicaps will be allowed and groups of three or more boats will have to agree to race as a level-rating class. Finally, for the dedicated racers, after the Fall Series in late October and early November, there will be a three day Frostbite Series.

Based on the survey responses, the Red Book was modified to allow the Offshore RCs more flexibility this year in deter-

mining the number of races to run, the length of the races, and where they will be run.

This year, offshore RCs WILL signal their intention to run additional races by displaying Code Flag "R" at the finish line. If Code Flag "R" is flying at the finish, skippers should remain in the vicinity of the Committee Boat and watch for the warning signal for the next race shortly after the last boat finishes the current race. RCs are being encouraged to run as many races as time allows on the good days!

To allow more races to be run each day, the time limit for our standard round-the-buoys race has been reduced to two hours and the starting sequence has been changed so that the warning signal for PHRF-SPIN is the preparatory signal for MORC. In the past the starting signal for PHRF-SPIN was the preparatory signal for MORC.

If conditions warrant, RCs will fly Code Flags "F" over "B" when leaving the dock and hail on Channel 72 indicating their intention to race on Fishing Bay and the adjacent Piankatank River.

Now, if worrying about changes to the Red Book and crew for multi-weekend racing series isn't your idea of fun, you should try one of our non-traditional events this year. On Memorial Day Sunday, following the race to Urbanna, we will run a series of buoy races in conjunction with the Rappahannock River Yacht Club. After the races we will join them for a raft-up and cookout at their club on Carter's Creek that night. They have a large PHRF-C class and should also have some NON-

SPIN boats competing.

Three weeks later, on June 23 & 24, FBYC will host the 2nd Annual Volvo Leukemia Cup Regatta. This will be a great, fun event which also supports a good cause. This event starts the Friday night at the end of Junior Week with a reception and silent auction, and continues on Saturday with the racing and a Grand Gala & Awards Party that evening. We hope all racing and cruising boats will participate in this year's Leukemia Cup Regatta.

On July 29-30, the Cruising Division will sponsor their annual Cruising Regatta. The Cruising Division will also sponsor the Onancock Cruise/Race on September 15-17.

Section 1 - Duties of Officers and Committees

ONE-DESIGN LIEUTENANT COMMANDER: The One-Design division lieutenant commander shall be appointed by the Commodore. ~~He shall perform such duties as may be assigned by the One-Design Division Commander.~~ He shall prepare and revise detailed written instructions for the One-Design race committees to record race results and distribute these to the CBYRA Delegate. He shall also be responsible for recruiting Event Chairs for all One-Design regattas whose primary objective is to insure all on-shore arrangements are completed before racers come ashore. He is also to assist the race committee in locating and awarding trophies. The One-Design Lieutenant Commander shall also perform such other duties as may be assigned by the One-Design Division Commander.

PIANKATANK RIVER PROGRESSIVE DINNER CRUISE**

Saturday, April 29, 2000 & Sunday, April 30, 2000

(Cruise chairpersons are Bill & Sarah Carneal, Vic & Jane DeNunzio, John & Fay Koedel)

This weekend of feast and fun is a great excuse to get the boat de-winterized and back in the water early. The first cruise of the season will involve an invigorating and challenging sail up the Piankatank River to the anchorage at LAT. 37°32.38' N and LON. 76°24.03' W (directly off of DeNunzio's dock). Go about 150 yds. past R "14" (at the southern tip of Horse Point) and turn to 320°M. Run along docks on Horse Point for about 0.5 nm and the DeNunzio Dock is next to last one with "American Pie II" docked. The depth at the end of the docks is about 9-10 ft. or more. The cove here is reasonably protected from all directions and about 20 - 25 feet deep. We can form raft-ups and water taxi will provide transportation to cocktails, dinner, and breakfast. Once anchored our modern fleet of water taxis will whisk you to all events thus eliminating the need to haul anchor, re-anchor, fend each other off, etc., etc., etc.

Itinerary:

Sat. arrival -1630 – Activities include swimming, fishing, crabbing, reading, sleeping, chatting, dinghy racing, etc.

Sat. 1630 -Water taxis will pick up from your boat or DeNunzio dock for cocktails at Bill and Sarah Carneal's. Wine, rum, beer and soft drinks and hors d'oeuvres will be provided.

Sat. 1830 – Water taxis will pick up from Carneal's and drop you off at DeNunzio's for dinner and party. Transportation to your yachts for the evening will be available as required.

Sun. 0900 – Either cruise to breakfast at John and Fay Koedel's
or take water taxi from the DeNunzio dock..

Cost for the full weekend event is \$20.00/per person. This includes water taxi, Cocktails and hors_d'oeuvres, complete dinner w/ wine & dessert, and breakfast on Sunday Morning.
