peting for the first time in his Mobjack. There were fleets of Albacores, Hampton One Designs, Buccaneers, Moths and Lasers which included a large Junior group. The Albacore and Hampton fleet tied for the Governors Cup. They each had 15 boats competing.

The next Wednesday we hit the road again. We spent the night with the Kupersmith's in Alexandria and went to Annapolis on Thursday to practice for the Sears, Bemis, Smythe Qualifiers. Blake Kimbrough, Lucy Kupersmith, and Malcolm Cobb sailed a J-22 for Sears, and Anthony Kupersmith sailed Lasers for Smythe. It is a good thing we got there a day early as the J-22 we had arranged to

borrow had fallen through. We spent most on Thursday securing a replacement boat. Many thanks to Will Crump and Ted Kazmarski for helping us with this project. On Friday, Anthony qualified in Lasers and went on to the Area C qualifiers for the

Malcolm finished 9th in Lasers even though he was still hurting from his Jr. Week injury. Mickey and Frannie had some strong finishes in the 49-boat Opti fleet. All in all, everyone sailed well and learned a lot from the experience. The week of July 17th Cam and I left for the Bay Open Championships at West River Sailing Club with Chris Fehn and Ashton Hudgins' optis. Because this was Chris' first 'away' regatta, we were all impressed with his two 20th place finishes in the first races Tuesday and Wednesday. Ashton, being the old pro on the Bay racing

scene, was right there with Chris most races. They each finished respectively in a 50 plus boat fleet.

Our last big trip of the season turned out to be the biggest. We left Deltaville august 2nd with a nicely loaded trailer heading to Easton, Maryland to sail at Tred Avon Yacht Club and Miles River Yacht Club in their Junior Regattas. Log of the Galatea

Introduction by Wes Jones, Log by Maurice Guimont

Fishing Bay members Maurice and Judy Guimont of Gloucester are among some of our more travelled members. Log readers may remember that they departed the Caribbean last spring and transited to Spain via Bermuda and the Azores.

They spent the summer on the Atlantic coast of Spain and finished the fall cruising in areas just inside the Med. In late fall they left Galatea in Gibraltar and returned home for Christmas, returning to resume their cruising in April. Their latest report below will bring you up to date on some of their activities this summer. Wes

We are in Sardinia now, and the summer is 3/4 ths over. It really is quite different sailing here compared to home or the Caribbean. Contrary to what we expected, there is lots of wind. In the Gulf of Lyon, they regularly get gale force winds even in the summer. It seems to be very hard to predict the weather. The forecasters are wrong regularly. Or you will get a forecast that will say: Sardinia, variable force 2 - 4 with chance of showers. That means that the wind can come from any direction, and be anywhere from 4 to 16 knots, and the sun may or may not shine. Today the German weather said that there was a high over Menorca, whereas the French were saying it was a low. One would think that they should be able to get that right.

We have been able to anchor out every night since leaving the coast of Spain at the end of June. The marinas are very impressive and very expensive during July August and September. Some charged up to \$3.00 per foot of boat length per night. This comes down to 1/10th of that during the off-season. We have been fortunate to find good anchorages. There are quite a few large well protected bays in the Balearics and here in Sardinia which are not too crowded. The one we are in tonight has about 20 boats in it, 30 ft up to 150{\i }{ft both power and sail. The bay is about 1 mile wide by 2 miles deep. Espalmador in Ibezia, (where the nudie beach is) is about a half mile long and 600 yards wide. It had about 35 boats in it while we were there. Once we had a 180 degree wind shift in about a half hour and half of the boats dragged. We did not I am proud to say. It was a zoo in there for the

next two hours with boats trying to avoid each other, the rocks and resetting. We heard on the cruising net this morning that last night there were about 300 boats in there. Can you imagine the chaos if they get a strong wind shift. We try to avoid places crowded like that. Better to settle for a long dinghy ride.

There are a lot of charter boats, and many of the charterers have no idea where or how to anchor. In Mahon, in Menorca we had to stand anchor watch one night. This 40 foot Spanish boat anchored alongside of us. The wind piped up to 25 knots and his boat started gyrating something terrible. We ended up putting our 9 fenders all on one side, so that we would not be damaged the few times he hit us broadsides. The people on the Spanish boat slept through it all. About a dozen out of 50 boats dragged that night.

The navigation is not very hard. The area has been sailed in for the last 3,000 years or so. The charts are very detailed and reliable. We now have electronic charts, and use them quite a bit. They are very handy. However the program we have, Visual Navigation 4.0.227 by Nobeltec needs some improving. One place is where they join two charts together. Sometimes they don't mesh or overlap by quite a bit. This could put you up on the rocks if one were not careful, and chose the wrong side of the seam. This problem also plays havoc with the crosstrack error. So until we get an upgrade, we will continue to use our Trimble UPS as our primary navigation device (plus the old eyeball).

Sailing is alive and well over here. Everywhere we go, we see hundreds of sail boats, of every size. We see many sailing schools also. The kids leave all kitted up in the morning in big inflatables dragging a bunch of Optimist prams, or Pico Lasers. The instructors hover around giving instructions. We have seen them out in 15 knot winds, trying not to jibe.

The other mode that is extremely popular is wind surfing. When the sea breeze sets in, they come out. There

were probably 150 of them going back and forth yesterday. They are very colorful. Skill levels are anywhere from novice to expert. We have also seen some sailboards being pulled along by large kites. They go very fast and have spectacular spills.

There are good supermarkets and open air markets, so provisioning has been easy, and much cheaper than either in the Bahamas or the Caribbean. The cell phone system in Europe is absolutely great. One can buy a chip in whatever country and then prepay, so there is no hassle with billing. We use it for our email, and usually can do all the e-mailing we want for less than \$0.50 per day, not counting the AOL basic rate.

It feels strange to enter an anchorage where frequently we are the only American boat. There is an English speaking cruising net each morning, so we can keep track of each other that way.

Hope you all are fine, and we look forward to hearing from you. Maurice
