Ralph Naranjo, technical editor of Cruising World magazine and the current holder of the Vanderstar Chair at the US Naval Academy, has authored two books and well over one hundred boating articles. He and his wife and children spent five years sailing their sloop *Wind Shadow* around the world, and he followed up with two decades worth of sailing and sailboats as a full time commitment.

A Cruising Conversation takes an audience to remote cruising grounds in Chile and New Zealand as well as closer to home, sharing the secrets of Maine, Nova Scotia, Newfoundland and the Bahamas. In addition to the theme of trade wind sailing and spectacular landfalls, you'll have a chance to take an up close look at what makes the Galapagos perhaps the most unique place on the planet and contrast it with the human drama of America's Cup 2000 in full swing in Auckland New Zealand.

Back closer to home you'll sail with the Naranjos from Nova Scotia to the Caribbean learning where to linger along the way. The program concludes with a sheltered ICW cruise through the backyard of rural America, then abruptly transplants you to the deck of the sixty foot sloop *American Promise* and her crew of midshipmen doing battle with a series of North Atlantic gales that lie between them and their landfall in England.

Naturally there's a question and answer follow up to the lecture and whether you're interested in what it takes to keep an old Westerbeke diesel alive or how it feels when you sail into Bora Bora's indigo lagoon, you'll find that a Cruising Conversation has appeal to each and every sailor.

Ralph Naranjo's photography has appeared on the covers of boating and general interest magazines, and his slide shows are always a compelling visual experience.

Here are the classes available for our members kids/grandkids:

1. OptiKids (sailors age 6-8) Class will be held the 2 weekends prior to Junior Week- June 9, 10, 16 & 17th. The class will be half days, and students will attend classes on all 4 days. **One parent MUST** accompany each student.

2. Beginning Opti (sailors age 9 or 10) You'll be sailing that Opti like a pro—with the help of a friend. **Two kids** in each boat will learn basic sailing skills while having FUN!

3. Intermediate Opti (sailors age 10 or 11) You've already learned the basics in the Beginning Opti Class last year. Now you're going to **sail alone!** You'll have lots of fun and learn a little more about getting the boat their first!

4. Racing Classes (sailors age 11 or over) You've completed Intermediate. You know how to get that boat going, but you want to get there **faster!** Bring your Opti, Byte, or Laser and learn from some of the best in your class. Maybe you'll join the FBYC Racing Team (you get your own T-shirt ☺) and have fun racing with other kids your age at our club, or at other clubs around the Chesapeake Bay.

5. Team Sailing Class (sailors age 12 and over; or who have completed Intermediate Sailing Class). We'll spend time **sailing with our friends** and try new stuff as a team. Members are again offering to let us use their Mobjacks for the class. We might even have more 420s. Tell your FBYC friends to meet you in the Team Sailing Class!

PARENTS: Usual progression in Junior Week goes like this:

1. OptiKids
2. Beginning Opti
3. Intermediate Opti,
4. then either Racing or Advanced Sailing Class

If you weren't lucky enough to start your child's sailing career at age 6, select the class which seems age and skill level appropriate (call me if you have questions). Over age 11, with no sailing experience (deprived children!), I would recommend Advanced Sailing Class—they'll learn quickly!

Junior Week Parent Jobs—during OptiKids Weekends and Junior Week

Many hands make the work easy!

-Power Boat Operations – Insure boats are refueled each day and operational.

-T-shirt Distribution — Insure T-shirts are distributed to the various sections on the last day of instruction for OptiKids and Junior Week.

-Check-in at FBYC for the “check-in” period the first morning of instruction for OptiKids. For Junior Week, “check-in” will be held the Sunday prior to the start of Junior Week and the first morning of instruction for approximately 1 hour each time. Check-in will be for the purpose of collecting medial and liability forms, and any outstanding payments.

-Photographer — takes ‘action shots’ of students during instruction. Make photos available to parents during the class sessions. Arrange for group photo for both OptiKids and Junior Week participants, and make available to members at their expense.

-Social — Coordinate and execute any social activity chosen! Acquire and insure secure distribution of daily snacks for each section.

-Large Dingy Launching — Responsible for launching One Design Boats loaned to the program by members for use in the Team Sailing Class. This is done before classes start each day.

-Doctor of the Day — (Pre-requisite: must be a doctor!) serve as Doc of the Day for one day of Junior Week or OptiKids.

-Parent of the Day — Carries hand held radio to communicate with each class. Familiar with phone locations at the club. Handle minor medical problems (mostly nettles or ‘windy day’ induced stomachaches☺) Contact Doc of the Day if necessary. Has access to all medical forms and liability release forms if necessary for medical evacuation of students. Contact parents if necessary.

Bordeaux Carcassonne Provence

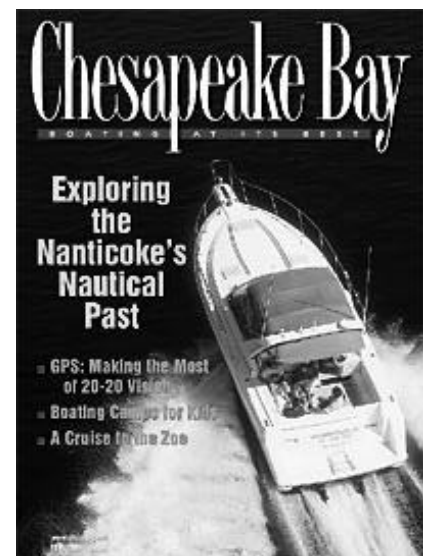

Planning Already Underway for 2001 Leukemia Cup Regatta ***FBYC Again Plays Host to Top Southern Chesapeake Event***

Despite the frigid and dreary winter weather during the past few weeks, planning is already well underway for one of the summer's top sailing events. The 3rd Annual ***Southern Chesapeake Volvo Leukemia Cup Regatta*** will again be held in Deltaville, and will again be hosted by Fishing Bay Yacht Club. This year's regatta dates are **Friday and Saturday, June 22-23**. Most of this year's regatta activities will be at Stingray Harbor Marina due to construction of FBYC's new clubhouse.

Regatta officials, led by planning committee co-chair Judy Buis, have announced that the regatta will get off to an early start in 2001. Festivities begin with a fundraising Wine-Tasting, Auction, Gary Jobson video presentation. The event will be held in Richmond Friday evening, March 23, with times and a location to be announced soon. Jobson, who is an honorary FBYC member and renowned sailing analyst and author, is expected to review and update developments taking place in several major round-the-world sailing races, including the Vendee Globe, the BT Challenge, The Race and the upcoming Volvo Ocean Race. Jobson was a founder and is now the national chairman of the Leukemia Cup Regatta series.

"Given the great welcome and success we enjoyed last year, we are extremely pleased to be invited to return to Deltaville and FBYC," says Pamela Stumpff, special events director of the Virginia Chapter of the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society. "We are extremely grateful to our volunteers, our sponsors and to the dedicated efforts of the members of Fishing Bay Yacht Club, who helped make the 2000 regatta such a huge success." The 2000 event attracted 88 sailboats, more than 600 participants and raised more than \$78,000 for leukemia research and patient care.

"This year we have a great line-up of activities slated for those who do take part," says Stumpff, "and we are inviting everyone to join us."

In addition to the wine-tasting, two other new regatta-related events are planned for 2001. A Junior "Icebreaker" Race involving teams of young sailors from 10 schools in the Southern Chesapeake region will be held at Christchurch School's sailing facilities on the Rappahannock River on Saturday, April 28. The race is sponsored by the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society, Christchurch School's sailing program and the Virginia Interscholastic Sailing Association (VISA). Top racers and fundraisers will be go on to participate in the Deltaville regatta in mid-June.

Also new this year is a Kayak/Canoe Tour of Mill Creek off the Rappahannock the day of the regatta, Saturday, June 23. The tour is being co-sponsored by LLS and Bay Trails Outfitters of Mathews County.

Several of the most popular activities from last year are again planned this year. There will be a Junior "Sail-a-thon" for young people aged eight to 15 at FBYC on Friday, June 22, followed by a Welcome Reception, Pre-registration and Silent Auction at Stingray Harbor Marina that evening. On Saturday, June 23, a Skipper's Breakfast opens the day followed by a VIP/Spectator Cruise and a series of CBYRA-sanctioned PHRF, MORC and one-design sailboat races on the Chesapeake Bay off Jackson Creek. A Grand Gala and Awards Ceremony will be held at Stingray Harbor Marina Saturday afternoon and evening. The Saturday Gala will feature a nautical Arts & Crafts Show, an Open-House Sailboat Display and a festive dinner and awards ceremony. Refreshments, music and dancing are included.

FBYC members have been active supporters and sponsors of the regatta since it was organized in 1998. In the past two years, the regatta raised has more than \$130,000, with many FBYC members serving as top fundraisers, regatta volunteers and regatta planning committee members. This year's fundraising goal is \$100,000.

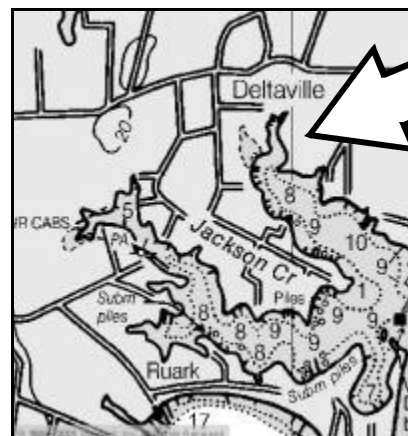
