CLUB MANAGER – Virgil Miller (reported by David Hazlehurst) - The septic tank is to be pumped and dredging to be done.

Here are the classes available for our members kids/grandkids:

1. OptiKids (sailors age 6-8) Class will be held the 2 weekends prior to Junior Week- June 9, 10, 16 & 17th. The class will be half days, and students will attend classes on all 4 days. **One parent MUST** accompany each student.

2. Beginning Opti (sailors age 9 or 10) You'll be sailing that Opti like a pro—with the help of a friend. **Two kids** in each boat will learn basic sailing skills while having FUN!

3. Intermediate Opti (sailors age 10 or 11) You've already learned the basics in the Beginning Opti Class last year. Now you're going to **sail alone!** You'll have lots of fun and learn a little more about getting the boat their first!

4. Racing Classes (sailors age 11 or over) You've completed Intermediate. You know how to get that boat going, but you want to get there **faster!** Bring your Opti, Byte, or Laser and learn from some of the best in your class. Maybe you'll join the FBYC Racing Team (you get your own T-shirt ☺) and have fun racing with other kids your age at our club, or at other clubs around the Chesapeake Bay.

5. Team Sailing Class (sailors age 12 and over; or who have completed Intermediate Sailing Class). We'll spend time **sailing with our friends** and try new stuff as a team. Members are again offering to let us use their Mobjacks for the class. We might even have more 420s. Tell your FBYC friends to meet you in the Team Sailing Class!

PARENTS: Usual progression in Junior Week goes like this:

1. OptiKids
2. Beginning Opti
3. Intermediate Opti,
4. then either Racing or Advanced Sailing Class

If you weren't lucky enough to start your child's sailing career at age 6, select the class which seems age and skill level appropriate (call me if you have questions). Over age 11, with no sailing experience (deprived children!), I would recommend Advanced Sailing Class—they'll learn quickly!

Junior Week Parent Jobs—during OptiKids Weekends and Junior Week

Many hands make the work easy!

-Power Boat Operations – Insure boats are refueled each day and operational.

-T-shirt Distribution — Insure T-shirts are distributed to the various sections on the last day of instruction for OptiKids and Junior Week.

-Check-in at FBYC for the “check-in” period the first morning of instruction for OptiKids. For Junior Week, “check-in” will be held the Sunday prior to the start of Junior Week and the first morning of instruction for approximately 1 hour each time. Check-in will be for the purpose of collecting medial and liability forms, and any outstanding payments.

-Photographer — takes ‘action shots’ of students during instruction. Make photos available to parents during the class sessions. Arrange for group photo for both OptiKids and Junior Week participants, and make available to members at their expense.

-Social — Coordinate and execute any social activity chosen! Acquire and insure secure distribution of daily snacks for each section.

-Large Dingy Launching — Responsible for launching One Design Boats loaned to the program by members for use in the Team Sailing Class. This is done before classes start each day.

-Doctor of the Day — (Pre-requisite: must be a doctor!) serve as Doc of the Day for one day of Junior Week or OptiKids.

-Parent of the Day — Carries hand held radio to communicate with each class. Familiar with phone locations at the club. Handle minor medical problems (mostly nettles or ‘windy day’ induced stomachaches☺) Contact Doc of the Day if necessary. Has access to all medical forms and liability release forms if necessary for medical evacuation of students. Contact parents if necessary.

Juniors To Launch Leukemia Cup Regatta!

Young sailors from Fishing Bay YC and throughout the Tidewater region will be joining the fleet for the **Christchurch Junior Challenge** sailing regatta being held at Christchurch School at **9:00am on Saturday, May 5**. The regatta will be held at the school's Rappahannock River sailing facility, and all FBYC members, friends and guests are invited to attend.

Sponsored by Christchurch School's sailing program, the Virginia Interscholastic Sailing Association (VISA), FBYC and the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society, an estimated 50 to 60 young people are expected to compete for racing and fundraising honors aboard

420s. The top fundraiser will win the James Keith Hall Memorial Trophy, honoring a 13-year-old Middlesex County boy who died from leukemia in January. Josh Gwilliam, sailing coach at Christchurch School, feels the regatta has special meaning because of James's passing. "James was well-known and well liked by many young people in the area," says Gwilliam. "We want to remember him by helping in the fight against leukemia."

Interested youngsters without boats are invited to join the junior fleet. Boats will be provided to those who need them. There is no registration fee for the juniors, but

the young sailors are being encouraged to raise funds for leukemia research and patient care here in Virginia. Top fundraisers and racers will be invited to take part in the 3rd Annual **Southern Chesapeake Volvo Leukemia Cup Regatta**, sponsored by FBYC and Stingray Harbor Marina, in Deltaville, Friday-Saturday, June 22-23.

Registration is now open for both the **Junior Challenge** and the **Southern Chesapeake Leukemia Cup Regatta**. Several FBYC members are hard at work on the regatta planning committee and can give anyone who is interested full details. Leukemia Cup Regatta Off To Solid Start

The first event in this year's 3rd Annual **Southern Chesapeake Leukemia Cup Regatta**, a Wine-Tasting Reception/Sailing Update on March 23 in Richmond, generated \$6,300.00 in donations, contributions and sailboat registrations. The reception was the first step in a series of events in this year's regatta, sponsored by Fishing Bay Yacht Club and hosted by Stingray Harbor Marina.

Highlights at the reception, attended by an estimated 125 people, was a video review of top sailboat racing action by well-known ESPN commentator and author, Gary Jobson. Jobson, who is an honorary FBYC member, reviewed the recent America's Cup and racing in last year's Olympics. He praised the American effort in the Olympics, in which U.S. sailors won

several medals, then forecast a possible America's Cup win for the U.S. when the series resumes in New Zealand.

Another popular feature at the reception was an auction of spectacular artwork by Richmond dentist Dr. Baxter Perkinson, who donated several original paintings to the regatta fundraising effort.

The wine-tasting was hosted by Barbourville Vineyards and the reception was hosted by Trigon Blue Cross-Blue Shield.

Upcoming regatta events include the Christchurch Junior Challenge on the Rappahannock on Saturday, May 5, the "Milling Around" Leukemia Cup Kayak Tour on the Rappahannock on Saturday, June 23, and the big sailing regatta and gala at Stingray Harbor Marina in Deltaville on Friday and Saturday, June 23-23.

Last year's regatta in Deltaville

raised \$78,000 and attracted 88 sailboats and an estimated 600 participants. The fundraising goal this year is \$100,000, with the money going for leukemia research and patient care here in Virginia.

Laser Tack: how to succeed in Laser racing by Alain

Simply...SAIL A LOT!!

Naturally, you must have a program to get yourself in this type of condition. And the best way to get into shape is to sail with an effective practice system.

Many top Laser sailors are strong believers of US sailing coach Gary Bodie. Their practice quality is more important than sheer quantity. You don't need to devote a whole day to sailing.

- Allow yourself a maximum 20 minutes to rig and dress (it can be done in 10 minutes if you have been practicing with the Navy.)
- Sail to your practice area and use this as your speed drill (great

to do with another boat.)

- Sail EXTREMELY hard for maximum of two hours.
- Maximize the experience with drills. Drills must isolate one particular skill or play.
- Stop/sail back. Also, use this as your speed drill.
- De-rig, shower. Analyze the lessons learned.
- Go to Little Sue, eat one, two, three pizzas...!

If the wind is too light or too heavy, or circumstances are not conducive to practice, you need a physical conditioning plan. Off the water exercises must be developed and

practiced on a regular basis. The plan should be specifically designed to strengthen arm, thigh, and stomach muscles, toughen hands and improve cardiovascular condition.

Use of a hiking bench is, also, strongly recommended to improve muscle tone.

15 minutes every day is a great place to listen to NPR news around 7am, after your one hour of bicycling to warm up....!!
