It is hard to imagine a prettier weekend to open... the sailing season than we had this year. The sun and temperature were perfect. The wind left a little to be desired on Saturday (actually the wind just plain left). However, after Reverend Bill Egelhoff blessed the Fleet, the Rennie twins led the annual singing of the

naval hymn, and Jon Moody and Mike Calkins treated us to an evening of great food, music and dancing, the wind did its part in time to give us good racing on Sunday, rounding out a beautiful spring weekend and an auspicious start to the sailing season. Mr. Roberts, Wildcat, and the club grounds and clubhouses were all looking their best and ready for action. The One Design fleets didn't get out to race, but pre-race preparations were much in evidence, and a strong turnout seems likely for the Stewpot Regatta on the 28th. A round of applause is in order for everyone who worked so hard over the last five months to get us here in such great shape.

The winter and spring race committee training sessions and David Hazlehurst's crew development initiative accomplished their goals of recruiting and preparing new crew and race committees. George Burke and Ed O'Connor did a first class job organizing a safety seminar we hope will become an annual pre-season opportunity to increase awareness and knowledge of safety related issues for anyone venturing out into the Bay and beyond. But the training and learning opportunities don't stop when the season begins. Elizabeth Staas is planning to provide racing rules and tactics seminars over the course of the year, team racing workshops are on the drawing board, and there will be further opportunities to master operation of our Race Committee boats. Proposals for hands on sessions with marine electronics, and for an afternoon of participatory man overboard (or is it Person In Water?) drills in Fish-

ing Bay aimed at families who cruise the bay (and anyone else who wants practice), are all being fleshed out. So keep your eyes out for these and other chances to increase your knowledge. Each of these programs is also an opportunity to pass on what you know by volunteering to help out. If you want to get involved, or have an idea for a program or activity you'd like to see the club offer speak up and let us know. Helping each other master "the art and science of sailing" and acquire "knowledge of the theory and practice of seamanship, navigation, meteorology . . . and allied subjects" is what we do and what we are here for.

Within a month after my holding forth so confidently about how good our budgeting and planning processes are, our ability to deal with unwelcome surprises without abandoning our priorities or exceeding our budget is being put to the test. As you may have noticed, the drysail hoist on Jackson Creek is out of commission. The hoist, which was used when we got it in 1989, seems to have reached the end of its useful life, and preparations are underway to replace it and get it back in service as quickly as possible. On a happier note, the pool work is on schedule for completion in time for the opening of the pool Memorial Day weekend, and Ric Bauer and his band of volunteers are on target to complete installation of a wood floor in the barn by the time you read this.

Plans are already well underway for the annual race to Urbanna and our return to Rosegill for the celebration of the end of the spring sailing season and beginning of summer, but between now and then we have six weeks of the sailing and racing we've been looking forward to all winter. Sail safe, sail fast, and sail fair. If I don't see you on the docks...

I'll look for you on the water.

FBYC BOARD MEETING

HIGHLIGHTS

April 12, 2007

Meeting called to order at 6:05 p.m. by Commodore Allan Heyward.

REAR COMMODORE – R. NOEL CLINARD

SECRETARY – Four members are delinquent in paying their dues and will receive certified letters advising that if payment in full is not received by April 30, membership will be suspended. A New Member Reception will be held again this year in conjunction with a Board meeting in Deltaville on a

date to be determined at the May Board meeting.

HOUSE – Wes Jones advised that the painters have finished painting the clubhouse.

DOCKS – Alex Alvis reported that all slips have been assigned and there are three boats on the waiting list. A survey of the docks (depths, widths, etc.) has been made and the annual maintenance and inspection of the hoist has been performed; however, the hoist is currently out of service but repairs should be completed before Opening Day.

SOCIAL – Mike Calkins would like to invite Hampton YC, Rappahannock River YC and Yankee Point YC to the Rosegill social.

GROUNDS – Clean Up Day was very successful with 52 volunteers. Mayo Tabb has been coordinating with David Lee of the Stove Point Improvement Association (“SPIA”) about purchasing several signs designed to slow traffic to be installed on the east and west sides of the property. A white “cross walk” will also be painted on the road in line with the west entrance.

Ric Bauer discussed the pool repair work. An inspection with the plastering contractor showed that the entire bottom and many spots on the sidewalls were chipping and must be repaired. The “baby” pool will be repaired at the same time and the pools should be ready by Memorial Day weekend.

Strother Scott recommended that a representative from the club discuss SPIA’s proposed water system project with David Lee and de-

termine to what degree, if any, the club should be involved.

WEBMASTER – All of the Sailing Events now have “Chairs” listed online. David Hazlehurst has provided Strother Scott with the data for the 2007 crew candidates. Strother has created a new Crew Finder link, which includes the 2006 and 2007 candidates, and is accessible on the home page. The new Volunteer system has been set up on the web site and Strother reviewed the different sections of a “Manual for Web Site Tools & Events” and how the Manual can be used to manage events and volunteers. Commodore Heyward asked that Board members review the Manual, try out the web tools available during the next 30 days, and be prepared to decide at the May Board meeting how we can best implement a system to record all volunteer names.

PUBLICITY – David Hazlehurst advised that Valerie Hubbard is working on an article for Virginia Living. Lee Graves, a sports reporter for the Richmond Times Dispatch, plans an article on crew recruiting.

VICE COMMODORE – **RICHARD A. BAUER, JR.**

FLEET CAPTAIN – Jay Buhl sent the 2007 Sailing Schedule to the Coast Guard. Jay expressed thanks to everyone involved in the training sessions conducted this year to date and especially to David Lee who has already spent 8+ days focused on Race Committee training.



ONE DESIGN DIVISION – Tom O’Connell advised that he has checked the boats in the small boat parking lot and there are some that do not have sticker numbers, which is a requirement for all boats whose owners have paid to keep them there. He will try to determine the names of the boat owners.

CRUISING DIVISION – George Burke reported that 67 people registered for the Safety at Sea program on April 14 in addition to the special guests and speakers.

JUNIOR DIVISION – To date, there are 43 signed up for Junior Week, 17 for OptiKids and four for Learn2Sail. Eric Powers suggested that the early registration deadline be extended 10 days. The Board agreed that the lease to rent a small house at Gene Ruark’s marina should be signed to accommodate the Junior coaches. Eric is still trying to hire a local coach (paid) to help with spring practices and some CITs (unpaid) to assist the coaches during Junior Week. FBYC is also working with Christchurch School, Hampton YC and St. Christopher’s School to bring high school sailing to the club. Several events will be held at the club in April/May that will include some FBYC juniors. It is hoped that this cooperation will lead to the eventual development of a club-based FBYC high school sailing program.

FLEET LT. – Mike Dale reported that the hull on Mr. Roberts has been repaired and new equipment for the boats has been installed.

PROTEST – Elizabeth Staas needs a room that will hold more than 20 people for the Dave Pyron Racing Rules seminar and would appreciate hearing from anyone who has a location to recommend.

PARTICIPATION – David Hazlehurst reported that 15 people turned out for the first day of on-the-water crew training. The April 7 session was not held because of snow. Brochures prepared by Jon Deutsch advertising the club have been printed and are ready for use.

NEW BUSINESS – Ric Bauer presented drawings showing the projected use of the 10 stalls in the barn located on the new property. Three of the stalls are currently being used by Dixon. He recommended that three be used for the Junior Division and two for one-design storage, with two uncommitted at this time. He has an estimate for installing wood flooring in seven of the 10 stalls, and the Board approved the installation of the flooring system.

Allan Heyward announced that several recommendations concerning the 4-year membership rule for sponsors under the Membership Guidelines would be brought up for discussion before the Board in May.

Tom Hawksworth has contacted Chip Hall about making Jackson Creek a “no discharge” body of water. Stove Point residents want more enforcement of the law pertaining to what is discharged into the creek.

There being no additional business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:05 p.m



SAFETY AND SEAMANSHIP SEMINAR



73 members, community guests, and speakers attended the FBYC Safety at Sea Course, presented in the FBYC clubhouse, on 4/14/07. Our speakers were led by moderator Sheila McCurdy who chairs the US Sailing National Faculty and is a US Sailing Passage Making Training instructor. Joining Sheila were Dr. Jim Barton, an emergency medicine specialist who served as ship's physician for the 1985 trans-Atlantic Godspeed voyage, Jim Campbell, instructor for the USCG National Search and Rescue School, Pat Healy, former sailing instructor for the US Naval Academy and marine meteorologist, Ray Walden from the Deltaville fire department, and Chip Kinsey, an ATB commissioning captain and former tugboat skipper. Each gave his perspective on sea safety issues pertinent to Bay and coastal sailing. The success of these speakers can be gauged by the remarks of one very experienced FBYC offshore racing skipper who said "before I came to this course I thought my knowledge of safety issues was on a 7 out of 10 level; instead, I was a 1.5!" With their donations and good will, multiple sponsors helped to subsidize this program. Unique #3. Deserted Island. Sandy Point is a deserted island on the northern side of The Hole in the Wall. Check your chart for a place to anchor. You can't get real close but the dinghy ride is short. There is one place that has a 7' spot you can drop your anchor in else, you will be in 9'. This is a fun place to spend the day ashore with a picnic and then return for a bon fire later on.

Unique #4. Closest Neighboring Yacht Club. Mathews Yacht Club is up Stuttts Creek. We have reciprocal rights with them and they usually have a couple empty slips. They have a pool. A one option dinner is served on Saturday nights. No bar but they have a bar tender. How does that work? You bring your own bottle, give it to the bartender, and he serves it to you. You pay for mixers.

Judith Woodbury, noted Deltaville artist, has donated a watercolor, shown here, to The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society for the Auction scheduled this summer in conjunction with The Leukemia Cup Regatta.
