#### FBYC BOARD HIGHLIGHTS June 2012

Meeting called to order at 6:05 p.m. by Commodore Alex Alvis.

#### REAR COMMODORE - JOHN B. WAKE JR.

**HOUSE** – A gas grill has been donated by **John Wake** for use at Fannie's House. **Ted Bennett** reported that repairs to the oven in the caterer's kitchen have been completed.

**DOCKS** – The water and power are back on in the cut slip and the bulkhead replacement has been completed.

**GROUNDS** – A third dumpster will be in place for the next three months for recyclables only. There are seven new recycle cans in various places on the property. **Noel Clinard** suggested that a notice be included in the Log advising members of the recycling program.

WEB MASTER – Strother Scott has added event registration on the web site for all upcoming events except for Indian Summer, Laser Master's, Wilton Creek Cruise and the Annual Party. He does not have item prices for those events yet. Strother's Russian programmer, Eugene, has been able to perform about 30 hours of work on the web's registration program in the past month.

MARKETING – Jay Buhl, David Hinckle and the Regatta committee have obtained sponsorships with Ullman Sales and with Chesapeake Railway/ Stingray Boat Works for Stingray. Jay has ordered or received quotes on various items for use at the AOD and Stingray regattas. The Stingray brochure has been published and Jay has marketed the event to Lin McCarthy, SpinSheet, Southside Sentinel, the web site and the Log.

**OPERATIONS MANAGER** – The Zodiac RIB has a rubber separation issue and Davis Boat Works is making warranty repairs.

#### VICE COMMODORE - GEORGE W. BURKE III

**FLEET CAPTAIN** – After reviewing the safety manual prepared by **David** and **Alison Lennarz** for the Junior program, Matt Braun believes it would be a good idea to create a similar safety program for the club and he plans to search for workable safety programs that can be used in creating one for FBYC.

**OFFSHORE DIVISION** – The Spring Series scoring has been completed. **George Burke** asked the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society contact person to send a list of the registrations for the Leukemia Cup Regatta to **Paul Wash** and **Brad Miller** so that they can build scoring forms.

**ONE DESIGN DIVISION** – **Rob Whittemore** needs a new PRO for the July 4th race and he plans to find out if there is a club social event on July 4th or if someone in One Design should plan for an after-race social.

**CRUISING DIVISION** – There are two more cruises in June - the Father's Day Cruise and a 2-night cruise up the Potomac. **George Sadler** gave an update on OpSail 2012. Six FBYC boats were right in the heart of everything all weekend and the cruisers thoroughly enjoyed the event. They participated in the Parade of Sail with the tall ships.

JUNIOR DIVISION – David Lennarz advised that he plans to use the Safety Manual and Risk Management policy during this summer's Junior events. The first weekend of OptiKids was a great success and Junior Week begins on Monday with a total of 118 participants. The Opti and Laser Race Team coaches arrived on June 7 and David has received excellent reviews from team sailors and parents who have interacted with them. The Laser Race Team visited OpSail in Norfolk on June 10 because the Laser Race Team coach is a personal friend of the Captain of the Ecuadoran tall ship that is visiting in Norfolk. The Captain gave the race team a private tour of the ship. A Race Teams Kick-Off dinner was held at the club on June 9 with approximately 70 sailors and families in attendance. A coordination meeting of the Opti Development Team was held at the club on June 9. One ODT coach, Will Bomar, worked during OptiKids to rave reviews. The other ODT coach, **Ben Buhl**, begins coaching soon. **Jef Londrey** and his volunteers are making last minute preparations for the Commonwealth of Virginia Junior Championship Regatta. A number of Chesapeake Bay clubs have confirmed they will have members in attendance.

**REGATTA COMMITTEE** – **David Hinckle** advised that registration is now on the web site for AOD and Stingray and he has the key people for leadership roles in place. There will be a pancake breakfast at the club on Sunday morning before the last day of the Stingray Point Regatta. David will meet with all of the PRO's for both events to develop racing courses based on wind conditions. He still needs many volunteers.

**OLD BUSINESS** – Alex Alvis advised that the bulkhead project has been completed and that there were some cost overruns. The contractor has requested that the club pay approximately half of that cost. While the contractor was at the club, he gave Alex some ideas about fixing the Fishing Bay ramp. Alex discussed the three suggested methods but the club has no plans to make the repairs during this fiscal year.

NEW BUSINESS - Doug Anderson led a discussion to address the club's volunteer participation policy. He believes there is some correlation between membership retention and volunteer involvement. Doug's recommendation was to create a position of Volunteer Coordinator who would report directly to the Rear Commodore to enlist and/or assign members (new and existing) to specific events and to keep tabs on volunteer hours performed. The goal is to produce more participation from the membership. Doug is concerned about volunteer burn-out among those members who volunteer so often. There was some discussion about the volunteer tools already in place on the club's web site and the fact that they are not being fully utilized. David Hinckle said there needs to be a way of reaching out to more of the members to get them involved. Rather than creating a new Board position, Alex Alvis said he preferred that each of the four Division Commanders name someone within their Division (could be themselves) to discuss ways of getting members to participate/volunteer. Alex said the task of getting more members to volunteer could be included in the job description of current Board members in each Division. Alex asked Matt Braun to lead in this effort.

There being no additional business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:35 p.m.


## New York Yacht Club Rededicates Historic Resolute Trophies to the USQS and The International Cup By Noel Clinard, USQS Campaign Coordinator

The New York Yacht Club has announced the rededication of two historic trophies as perpetual awards for its U.S. Qualifying Series and International Cup events. The trophies are those awarded to the storied racing yacht *Resolute* in 1915 for winning the Long Island Series, and for her performance in the NYYC Cruise that same year. *Resolute* was designed by the legendary Nathanael Herreshoff for a NYYC syndicate to contend for the 1914 America's Cup, and christened by Grace Vanderbilt. She defeated all contenders in the 1914 Trial, including *Vanitie* and *Defiance*, and set a new course record; but the onset of WWI caused the race to be postponed. She prevailed again in the Trials and, ultimately, the Cup in 1920, defeating *Shamrock IV*. The former trophy will be awarded to the winner of the 2012 USQS, and thereafter to successive winners. The latter has been rededicated for the Invitational Cup itself.

Twenty-four U.S. yacht clubs, including Fishing Bay, will compete for the *Resolute* Cup in the USQS on September 4-8, at NYYC's Harbour Court in Newport RI. The top three finishers in that series will be invited to participate in the Invitational Cup in 2013 with larger crews in Swan 42s. NYYC has observed, as an indication of the quality of racing in the 2010 qualifying series (in which Fishing Bay competed), the three winners from that year placed 3rd, 4th and 5th in the 2011 Invitational Cup the next Fall.

The 2012 series will be sailed in Sonars and J70s. In preparation for the 2012 series, the FBYC Team of Blake Kimbrough, Matt Braun and John Wake will sail a combination of the three remaining big 2012 Sonar events, including the Marblehead NOOD, the NE Championship in Falmouth MA, and the Sonar North Americans in Rochester, NY, as well as practice in Fishing Bay, Annapolis and Newport in the new J70.

The Campaign is still seeking support from individual members to fund the logistics of travel and coaching for these events. Contributions can be sent to Fishing Bay Yacht Club, P.O. 
