FBYC BOARD HIGHLIGHTS - February & March 2014

FISHING BAY YACHT CLUB - BOARD MEETING
February 20, 2014 – Retreat Hospital

The World Cruising Club has requested use of the club on June 10th. There being no foreseen conflicts, Board approved their use of the facilities.

DOCKS CHAIR – David Clark: The dock on Fishing Bay side is complete. The rotor phase motor for the lift has arrived and will be installed– the power cable is also being replaced and there will be a new bag for the hoist chain. The bulkhead is being patched.

WEB MASTER – Strother Scott: Strother reported a very busy month with highlights including:

- Updated Board Web Page: Each member can have two photos as well as “elevator text”. The page is now much easier to manage and loads faster.
- Repaired News Comments Captcha, Search and RSS Feeds

Members also discussed changes to Facebook...everyone is encouraged to “like” any FBYC posts they see, the more “likes” the more often posts are shown. Members are also encouraged to post their FBYC sailing pictures!

MARKETING – John Buhl: This year’s focus is on supporting strategic Membership initiatives. A committee has been formed to identify, discuss, and formalize a list of ideas for implementation that will strengthen the Value Proposition of being a member of FBYC. To be reviewed: Club Rules, member perks, Junior “sales engine”, club signage, etc. Members are encouraged to send ideas to Jay. Board felt strongly that FBYC should be open to the community.

JUNIOR DIV. CDR – Mark Hayes: 1) Four (4) professional coaches have been hired with Gabriel Moran once again serving as the Head Coach – visa application process for all coaches is currently under way; 2) 40 to 45 volunteers have committed to running Junior Week. Vendors, entertainers, caterers are all in place. Classes have been expanded (8 to 10 per class. Special thanks to **Bo Bragg** for making the Spring Sailing possible!

TROPHIES – Ed O’Connor: Engraving of all trophies has been completed. There is enough daily award stock to get through Opening Day and well into the spring season for all divisions.

REGATTA COMMITTEE – Matt Lambert: Matt reported that everything is coming together for the AOD and Stingray Regattas: vendors, caterers, NOR. He is currently looking into merchandising and building package pricing. Hampton One Design will be participating as a separate event with a 5th race course. Hampton will be providing their own resources.

OLD BUSINESS: Vice Commodore, Matt Braun, reported that the Adult Sailing program is coming together. Four (4) boats have been identified. The contract with Premium Sailing has accepted and finalized. A marketing program is currently being put into place to “spread the word”.

NEW BUSINESS: Certified Club Race Officers Training in Hampton – Noel reported a good turn-out, but arduous requirements for actually registering for the certificate. Can the club identify who in FBYC has this certification?

The Board recognized and heartily congratulated **Jon Deutsch** for being awarded U.S. Sailing’s prestigious One-Design Leadership Award. Jon was nominated by his fellow Laser sailors for this award. As part of this recognition, Jon attended the U.S. Leadership Forum and brought back a large catalog of knowledge and information to share with the Board and various Committees. Congratulations to Jon!

March 13, 2014 – Thalheimer Headquarters

HOUSE CHAIR – Joe Roos: The ceiling in the East bathhouse has been repaired.

DOCKS CHAIR – David Clark: The hoist is still not operational. At least 10 pylons on the Fishing Bay dock need to be replaced.

SOCIAL CHAIR – Caroline Garrett: Caroline reported that plans for Opening Day are set.

WEB MASTER – Strother Scott: The Sailing Events Book has been added to the FBYC web site. Board members are reminded to update their information on the Board web page.

HISTORIAN – Jere Dennison: The 75th Anniversary Commemorative Book will be ready and available by Opening Day.

OPERATIONS MANAGER – Dixon Cole: The property is ready for Spring.

CAPTAIN – David Lennarz: All events have been submitted and approved by the U.S. Coast Guard Sector Hampton Roads.

OFFSHORE DIV CDR. – Paul Wash: All race registrations are open, NORs posted, and socials ready.

ONE DESIGN DIV. CDR – Tracy Schwarzschild: There is an adhoc plan in place to attract the Rappahannock fleet of Flying Scots to participate at FBYC.

CRUISING DIV. CDR – George Sadler: All interested members are invited to attend the Cruiser Party on April 6th.

JUNIOR DIV. CDR – Mark Hayes: Race Team began practice at the club on March 8th & 9th. Private lessons are being scheduled.

PROTEST CHAIR – Mayo Tabb: The PHRF final Safety Regulations are on the PHRF web site. There have been significant changes made; everyone is encouraged to read them carefully.

NEW BUSINESS: New Storage Lockers: Plans and drawings for the construction of new waterproof lockers were presented. It is anticipated that the \$4500-\$5000 cost will be recovered in less than three years. A motion was made to allow \$5,000 to be spent on this project. The motion was seconded and approved.

Dock/Waterfront Survey: The goal of this survey is to assess the current condition and useful life of the docks and other waterfront structures and to assess future possibilities and timing for repair or replacement of such facilities. The proposal is for an evaluation of the entire facility. The cost of this survey is \$8,000. A motion was made to accept this proposal and proceed with the survey. The motion was seconded and approved.

Temporary Dock Usage Rate will be evaluated.

Commodore, John Wake, presented guidelines for this year’s FBYC Challenge Bowl. Following is the language for 2014: The 2014 FBYC Challenge Bowl will be presented to the Skipper of a J70 in the FBYC J70 Fleet with the best score, using a scoring system to be determined, giving appropriate weight to the Club’s Offshore Spring and Fall Series and certain specified travel events occurring after this date, including Davis Island (3), Charlestown Race Week, Annapolis NOOD, Southern Bay Race Week, J70 NACs, Screwpile, Marblehead NOOD, Stingray, J70 Worlds, Annapolis Fall Brawl, Hampton Fall Fling and J70 Chesapeake Championship.

We do all this by ourselves, and it has the added benefit of building relationships and strengthening friendships. 5, 4, 3, 2, 1...Sound familiar? It is Cathy Clark counting down the starting sequence for your race...Were you OCS? There is a good chance when you have raced at Fishing Bay or served on race committee, Cathy has been there. Serving on race committee is one of her passions. Since then, thankfully Cathy's race committee duties have not included battling the elements, but instead helping to ensure that the Fishing Bay Yacht Club race committee is professionally run. Anyone who races at FBYC knows Cathy's hard work is critical to the success of all of our racing programs. She continuously sets an example for others on race committee. Next time you see Cathy, thank her, because she is the reason you know how you did in that last race.

May 24 to Feature Celebrations of both FBYC and Deltaville Heritage

May 24 will feature two original celebrations of Club and Town Heritage. FBYC will hold its first "Open House Regatta" for any boat with a Portsmouth or PHRF rating with accompanying social events and music, aimed at bringing new people to the Club. AND Deltaville is sponsoring the first ever Deltaville Seafood Festival in the town and at the Deltaville Maritime Museum including displays and vendors as well as food and family focused activities.

The Club event will try to fill the boat shoes of the historic Rosegill Party, bringing our Memorial Day weekend celebrations closer to home, while we fondly remember Strother and Evie Scott's hospitality in Urbanna for so long. It will feature racing around government marks in the Piankatank, with some course options finishing right off the Club's Fishing Bay dock, followed by an offshore "Sunflower" raft-up of racing boats, serviced by shuttles from shore, a picnic, and Bluegrass Music in the evening. During the club racing, and as a shore-side option, the land-lubbers may want to venture downtown to enjoy the many displays and vendors, or paddle in the events at the Maritime Museum.

The Festival will feature on-the-water activities for kayakers and paddle-boarders from 11-2 at the museum. Families who already own kayaks and paddle boards are encouraged to bring them to tour Mill and Jackson Creeks. Contests will be held for prizes and honor. Loaners will be available. It will also include arts and craft vendors, five seafood vendors, tours on the *Explorer*, a raw bar featuring recently crowned national oyster shucking champion, displays at the museum and music. Bobby Messano, Grammy nominated guitarist and author of CD titles "Welcome To Deltaville" will play from 6-9 pm with warm-up acoustic set by David Moran at 5.

So, if you are looking for activities for your Memorial Day weekend out-of-town guests to do – with you or without you, put the FBYC Open House Regatta and the bicycle-friendly Deltaville Seafood Festival on your calendar.

Many FBYC members are volunteering on these events. FBYC's Open House Regatta was conceived by Caroline Garrett and her group tasked with modernizing club events and making them more family friendly. Len Guenther is the Race Chair and Social Chair; Elizabeth Staas is heading up the myriad activities. The Deltaville Festival leadership includes members Carolyn Schmalenberger as Event Chair, John Koedel as Finance Chair, Deborah Usry as Marketing Chair, and Lud Kimbrough as part of the Waterfront Events Committee, tasked with leading the kayak flotilla. The 2013 CBYRA Junior High Points Awards were presented at Annapolis Yacht Club on March 1. As usual, FBYC Junior Race Team members dominated in all classes! The series is made up of the annual open invitational junior regattas hosted by every major yacht club with a junior program on the bay, and scores are cumulative through the sailing season. Parents and coaches of sailors on the Opti Development Team share two common goals: to develop the sailors' skills while having fun!

The most rewarding aspect of ODT for parents is to see their child having fun while falling in love with sailing! Our coaches are keen on teaching, observing, and re-teaching skills that support improvement. This development continues during practices and at local regattas throughout the summer sailing season.

ODT sailors also enjoy themselves off the water. Some of the ways include pick-up games of soccer and lacrosse, and "Sharks and Minnows" in the pool. At away regattas, the families hang together on the water and off. Instead of "Soccer Moms or Dads," you become "Opti Moms or Dads!"

Perhaps the most exciting event for the 2013 season was the sailors' move from Green to White fleet. This occurred for most by the time of Annual One Design. A special award was presented to each of the ODT members by John Wake Jr. after the regatta to acknowledge the sailors' commitment and hard work during the summer season.

Continuing to promote ODT-and FBYC junior sailing- requires parent participation. Its not like soccer where you just drop your child off and the coach takes over! We have countless opportunities as a club to interact and collaborate with sailors of all levels. Each of us has a way to support young sailors in their their varying perspectives, skills, and interests. Interactions between members, coaches, and young sailors may seem like a normal day at FBYC, but they are really excellent educational opportunities for our young members. If you want to spend quality time with your child-do ODT!

RACING

Time and again, our Junior Division parent volunteers look for opportunities to help our sailors better themselves. Never satisfied with the status quo, our volunteers consistently look for caring, qualified coaches who relay gentle but sound instruction through experiences on and off the water. Wikipedia calls experiential learning “the process of making meaning from direct experience.” Our ODT coaches are equipped with the necessary resources, tools, and skill sets to provide these “experiences” on and off the water. Our coaches and parents helped the 2013 ODT sailors become a force to be reckoned with in the Southern Chesapeake Bay.

The team meets on Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays during the summer for practice at the club or to attend area regattas. Practices are generally half-day. Most regattas are in the southern bay. The only prerequisite is that sailors be comfortable sailing alone and have the ability to sail upwind. Generally, any junior who has completed Beginner and any Intermediate Class during Junior Week is qualified to sail on ODT. The fee for ODT is nominal, as the program is heavily subsidized by the club in order to promote junior sailing.




