THE FOUR SEASONS AT FISHING BAY YACHT CLUB

BOARD REPORT - January 2015

FISHING BAY YACHT CLUB - BOARD MEETING

Selected highlights from the January board meeting.

HOUSE CHAIR -

- 1. East Bathhouse Progress Update: The interior painting project is underway, and the ceiling in the men's side of the bathhouse is getting needed sheetrock repair.
- 2. Main Clubhouse: The new freezer was installed in the pantry. Work on the upstairs screened porch doors and back stairs is underway. The upstairs will be closed for approximately one month while the work is completed. Screens will be repaired in March.
- **3. Fannie's House**: The screens will be repaired in March, and the porch ceilings are slated for repainting.
- **4. Additional Work**: The exterior of the East Bathhouse is in need of painting, and we are getting quotes.

DOCKS CHAIR – Repair to the Opti ramp that was damaged in the storm will be completed shortly.

SOCIAL CHAIR – Summary of 2016 Events and Logistics:

1. 2016 Pricing: We will maintain the same caliber of events and continue to focus on families and affordability. Some events may see price increases.

2. Events:

- Opening Day: We will again have the Blessing of the Fleet on the Fishing Bay side preceded by post-race cocktails, followed by cocktail hour and dinner.
- Open House (Memorial Day): In 2015, this event truly reached across and outside the club. Format this year is similar with a circle raft up, pig pickin', and a band. This year the date is one day later (Sunday).
- **July 4th**: The intention is to create the same event and atmosphere as 2015, which was hugely successful and affordable.
- **Commodore's Ball**: We are researching venues and cost options for Commodore's Ball.
- **Annual One Design**: We are working to establish the event meal options, costing, etc.
- **Stingray Point Regatta**: White House Catering will cater, and we are working different menu options for Saturday. We will maintain Friday night pizza-like night and Sunday hot dogs, etc.

GROUNDS CHAIR -

1. Water System: Report of event water usage for 2014-2015 was reviewed, and the initial assessment points to an educational opportunity rather than an enhancement to the current water system.

- **2. Electrical**: The eave of the pool pavilion has been wired, so we will now be able to install a Wi-Fi camera overlooking the Junior area.
- **3. Barn**: A contractor has been hired to fix the buckling barn roof. We expect work to begin on the project at the end of February/beginning of March.
- **4. Pool and Pavilion**: The new pool cover has been ordered.

5. Miscellaneous:

- The construction of a longer fence to abut Jackson Creek is scheduled to start the end of January.
- As a follow up to the new 'signage,' we are evaluating a landscape plan for the new main FBYC sign on Fishing Bay Road. The old FBYC sign, originally located on a planter outside of Fannie's, was cleaned up and donated to the Deltaville Maritime Museum.

6. Future Projects:

 Evaluating laying sod in front of the junior ramp adjacent to the main clubhouse as well as looking for ways to improve the bottom of the ramp near the Junior area and the main dock.

MEMBER AT LARGE –The position of Adult Sailing Director has now been filled by Karen Soule. Karen will work with Matt on budgeting, planning and marketing this program.

WEB MASTER -

1. Database Project Has Satisfactory Completion: The huge website project was completed successfully and we relaunched January 4.

Going forward:

- All applications for website credentials, updates of profile records and password resets will now occur on our new (Django) website - new.fbyc. net.
- All event registrations still occur on our longstanding (Zope) website - www.fbyc.net.
- Credentials for both websites are identical.

The effect for those who use the website will be:

- New website users, those who show up for the first time in 2016 to register for an event, will need to create an account at new.fbyc.net, then use those same credentials to sign into www. fbyc.net to register for their events.
- If you forget your password, you will be sent to https://new.fbyc.net/accounts/password/reset/. Unlike before, all passwords are now encrypted, and we are unable to tell you your

password. The only option for password recovery is to reset it.

2. Combined Yearbook and Sailing Events Book: The website, https://www.fbyc.net/Access/Board/Yearbook-new has been updated with the process for getting the 2016 book ready to publish. In case some must do editing in Word, we also have https://www.fbyc.net/Access/Board/Yearbook for uploading files. The deadline for all information to be entered and ready for editing is January 31, 2016.

WINTER PROGRAMS -

- 1. **Speaker Program**: We reserved the Omni Hotel in Richmond on Wednesday, March 30th. Rob Overton will discuss offshore sailing for sailors who own their own boats and/or who are interested in chartering a boat.
- 2. Bermuda High Party: The Ullmans will be hosting the Bermuda High Party at their home in Glen Allen (West End) on Saturday, March 19th.

MARKETING – Phase III of the sign project is being initiated.

HISTORIAN – The FBYC exhibit at the Deltaville Maritime Museum is nearly complete, awaiting only the installation of the Opti. The fundraiser/open house party will likely take place at the end of May.

YAM CHAIR – Programming for 2016 is being developed with a focus on quality over quantity and a small committee of YAMs are being tapped to help set that direction.

FLEET CAPTAIN – Applications to the Coast Guard for permits for each of our events are in the works. A flag and marker inventory is being scheduled.

OFFSHORE DIV. CDR. – NORs are progressing. The current focus is on promoting the Stingray Regatta.

CRUISING DIV. CDR – All cruising events have been scheduled and leaders identified. There will be a good mix of long and short cruises. Welcome Cruiser's Party is scheduled for April 2nd at the club.

JUNIOR DIV. CDR -

- 1. Schedule and Web Pages: The 2016 schedule has been posted on the web, and an email with the schedule has been sent to Junior list members and past participants. CBYRA has completed the first draft of the Junior Schedule and will publish in February. We are working on first draft of Race/Development team travel schedules.
- **2. Coaches**: Six summer coaching positions have been

- filled, and we are working to identify coach to support Spring Race Teams.
- **3. Junior Week:** Working to fill approximately 45 'full time' volunteers for the week. Plans for social events are underway and caterer has been reserved.
- **4. Race Teams**: CBYRA results have been calculated, with FBYC sailors receiving 14 of 33 awards. Formal announcements and award ceremony are tentatively planned for March. We expect to have 40 45 sailors participate in summer development/race teams.
- **5. Support Boats**: Serviceability of the fleet was evaluated, and a need identified for a replacement boat for 2016 season.

CBYRA DELEGATE – Sanction numbers are on the Offshore Schedule.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Formal request made for a replacement support boat for the Junior Program. Recommendation to purchase a 14 foot RIB and have a mechanic evaluate engines during off season was approved.
- 2. The Front Runner fleet has not maintained its active status per club rules. The fleet has been put on probation with the intention of re-engaging owners in a discussion of what they really want.

IN MEMORIAM JAMES E. "RED DOG" COVINGTON



James Edward Covington, Jr., affectionately known to family, friends and colleagues as "Red Dog," passed away January 21, 2016. He was at home and surrounded by his family. Red Dog was born February 23, 1935 in Richmond, Virginia. He was the youngest of the three children of James Edward Covington and Annie Marshall James Covington.

For the first four years of his life, the family lived in Shanghai, China, where his father bought tobacco for Universal Leaf. When the Japanese invaded China in WWII, the family moved back to Richmond. In his youth, he spent summers on Beaver Creek Farm, the Hairston family place in Henry County, Virginia. He worked on the farm and it was there that he first gained his love of the land. Red Dog graduated from St. Christopher's School and then the University of Virginia as an undergraduate and law student.

While in law school, he met his wife of 55 years, Jane Elizabeth Ellis. They married in 1961 and after his graduation, the couple moved to Richmond, where he joined the law firm of Williams, Mullen, Christian, Pollard. In 1969, he created The Covington Company, a residential and commercial real estate development company that

is still in operation today. Red Dog was involved in his community. He was a long time member of St. Mary's Church, where he served as senior warden several times. He served on the Three Chopt Road Civic Association, where he was instrumental in preserving Bandy Field as a park and, he worked with Middlesex County to bring drinking water to residents. If the wind was up, he was on the water, sailing and was an active member of Fishing Bay Yacht Club since 1967. If the snow was falling, he was skiing on the slopes. And, if the sun was shining, he was on the golf course. At the Deep Run Hunt Club, he served as Master of Foxhounds twice, once from 1980 to 1985 and a second time from 2001 to present.

Red Dog is survived by his wife, Jane Ellis Covington; his daughter, Elizabeth Marshall Covington; and her sons, Marshall Hairston Humphries and Ellis Covington Humphries; his daughter, Jane Covington Motion and her husband, Andrew; and their daughters, Lillibet and Mary; his son, Jimmy Covington and his wife, Melissa; his sister, Anne Wilson Covington Thompson; as well as nephews, nieces, great-nephews and great-nieces.

The funeral services was held at 11 a.m. on Thursday, January 28, at St. Mary's Episcopal Church, 12291 River Rd., Goochland County. In lieu of flowers, please send gifts to St. Mary's Church and to St. Christopher's School Foundation.

2015 SUMMER DEVELOPMENT & RACE TEAMS

JOIN THE FBYC TEAM!

Are you ready for the summer? Would you and your kids love a truly memorable experience that includes sailing, travel and FUN with friends? Join one of FBYC's Junior Race Teams! Fishing Bay Yacht Club is renowned for the

success of its sailing teams across the United States and across the Chesapeake Bay. Our goal is to get kids on the race course, and the best way to do that is on a team with expert coaches and great friends. From 7-year-olds who have never raced to high school seniors ready to sail on the college level - we have a team for everyone. Last year, 47 juniors sailed on our six teams.

Registration for all teams and programs opened on February 1. Visit our website at https://www.fbyc.net/Juniors/Overview for information on all of our programs, and to register. Space is limited. Come join us!

Opti Development Team (ODT)

(6/24 through 8/14. Approx. ages 7 to 15)

This is where it all starts! The Opti Development Team is designed for beginning and novice racers in learning about racing. No prior racing knowledge or experience is required. The only prerequisites are Beginning Opti and at least one week of Intermediate Opti during Junior Week, or the equivalent experience.

The team's season begins June 24 and runs through August 14, meeting Thursdays through Sundays. The

team practices at the club or travels together to regattas on those days. Practices are typically four hours a day, either morning or afternoon. In addition to the two summer regattas at FBYC, the team will race at regattas close to home, including regattas at Hampton Yacht Club, Norfolk Yacht Club, Ware River Yacht Club, Rappahannock River Yacht Club, and Indian Creek Yacht Club. No session or regatta is mandatory, so tired sailors (and parents!) are free to take the day or weekend off.

Laser Development Team (LDT)

(6/24 - 8/14. Approx. ages 12 - 18)

In its second year the LDT is intended as an introduction to the Laser, and as a bridge between the Opti and Laser Race Teams, it will run much like ODT. It is appropriate for any junior who is new to the Laser Radial, no matter their racing experience.



Opti & Laser Race Teams

(6/14 – 8/14. Approx. ages 10-18)

The Opti Race Team and the Laser Race Team are intense travel teams intended for experienced racers. Sailors typically spend two or more years on the Development Team before joining the Opti Race Team, and then move to the Laser Race Team once they have outgrown Optis. The teams begin practice two weekends prior to Junior Week, take advanced racing classes during Junior Week, and then spend much of the balance of the season on the road. They typically take one day off per week. The primary goal is to score high in the Chesapeake Bay Yacht Racing Association Junior High Points Series, which is a series made up of invitational regattas at member clubs across the Bay. Both teams also attend national and international regattas. The teams are coached by internationally-known professional sailors and coaches. typically from South America.



Spring & Fall Opti and Laser Race Teams

The FUN is not limited to the summer! FBYC will also offer spring and fall teams for both Optis and Lasers in 2016. The teams are coached by professional coaches on a per diem basis. Families pay only for events their sailor attends, leaving time for other sports and busy school schedules. The teams practice at the club on weekends and attend local and national regattas. Due to the often challenging conditions, dry suits are required for each participant. These teams are intended for experienced racers; sailors must have at least one year experience racing for FBYC or a comparable program.

THE COMPETITION TROPHY RECEIVES A COMPLETE MAKEOVER

This perpetual award was first presented in 1981 by Commodore Beverly L. Crump. It is awarded to the Fishing Bay Yacht Club member skipper of a yacht or yachts

enrolled in the Club Register, who have most successfully represented FBYC in sailboat racing events conducted by other yacht clubs or associations during the past year. Such events may be either one-design or offshore and specifically shall include Chesapeake Bay events, and events with area, regional, national and international competition. This trophy is intended to recognize the unusual and outstanding efforts by FBYC members, the character of the event or events entered, the quality of the competition, the extent of the effort involved for the FBYC member and the participation of all Club members shall be considered as well as the member's performance of such event or events.

The original trophy was a plaque with a metal etched plate depicting various one-design and offshore boats in use at the time the award was first presented. The plague had space for 30 winner nameplates. In 2011, new winners nameplates started to be affixed to the back of the plague because there was no more room on the front. In 2015, Bev Crump and 2015 Commodore Matt Braun were exchanging sailing stories at a club function. The two Commodores began talking about the Competition Trophy and its history over the 34 years since its beginning. It was at that time Commodore Crump offered to underwrite the job of updating the trophy. The idea of an award for performance and participation at events away from the club and thereby spreading goodwill and the good reputation enjoyed by the club throughout the sailing community was popular and highly regarded. It had to continue.

After considering a remodel, the players involved decided on a whole new trophy with up-to-date features and plenty of space for winners for years to come. Features include half hulls with rigging of an Optimist, a Flying Scot and a J/105. The plaque has the nameplates for all the winners going back to 1981 and has enough new nameplates to accommodate winners through 2040. For 2015 the award was given to 12-year-old Gannon Troutman for his exceptional performances, far and wide, from Key West Race Week to J/70 Worlds in New Rochelle, France. Congratulations, Gannon!



CRUISERS: Yes, spring is on the way and each day brings more daylight. The Cruising Events Schedule is complete and there are a variety of cruises designed to meet the need and schedules of the membership. There are a total of 16 events including: two non-sailing socials, 11 shorter cruises between two and four days in length, and three long distance cruises longer than 10 days. The long-term mission of the FBYC Adult Sailing program is the development of sailing skills for members and prospective members, including the increased knowledge of boat handling, seamanship, navigation and safety; the furthering of this purpose through the promotion and encouragement of day sailing, racing and cruising. The program is meant to continue the development of lifelong sailors who will be great credits to the Fishing Bay Yacht Club and the greater sailing community.

In this role Karen will assist in placing crew members on boats in the Offshore and One Design divisions.
