

A STORMY START TO OUR LAST TWO MONTHS OF SAILING AT FBYC

The first sailing weekend in September brought the anticipated cooler weather but tropical storm Hermine was an uninvited guest at our Stingray Point Regatta. Our Regatta Chair, Bob Fleck, stayed on top of the developing storm and made all the correct and timely calls. As you know, the racing for Saturday and Sunday was cancelled early Thursday afternoon. This early call made it possible to minimize our financial losses and, more importantly, we did not get a large group of visiting sailors here stranded by high water. Social Chairs Paul and Julie Ann Wash were able to cancel, with minimum expense, the various vendor contracts and repurpose items that could not be cancelled.

The accuracy of weather forecasting allowed us to race on the Friday of Stingray and host a sold out Low Country Boil in the evening. A group of 85 enjoyed a pleasant evening with a spectacular sunset. Everyone was able to get safely to shelter for the night and by late night, the wind was howling and water rising. We were fortunate that Hermine backed off a bit and no significant damage occurred.

Switching to the operational aspects of our Club: We have a number of committees that have been working hard this year studying how FBYC can improve in the coming years. Please review the minutes where the activity of four committees is recapped. Two reports in particular will impact all of us.

The first report is the Long Range Planning chaired by David Hinckle. This report recommended we split the paid management of the Club into two distinct roles. We will be hiring a General Manager who will be the point of contact for members and guests. Dixon Cole will be our Maintenance Supervisor with the responsibility of maintaining all of our physical assets. The Board discussed and approved the implementation of this plan. Look for more details from David in *The Log*.

The second report is the Membership Initiatives Task Force chaired by Doug Anderson and Noel Clinard. The essence of this report is that the age distribution of our membership has dramatically moved toward the 70-plus range where we can expect to see a significant number of age driven resignations. We are still holding our membership near our recent high that occurred during the 75th anniversary drive (at this time we are down two memberships). This count will not continue if we lose focus by assuming the job is complete.

Under the leadership of Joe Roos, our 2017 Membership Chair, we will form five task forces all aimed toward enhancing and communicating the value of belonging to FBYC. These five groups are: (1) New Member Focus Group; (2) Membership Communications; (3) Food and Beverage Service; (4) Housing; and (5) Social and Waterfront. We welcome participation from any member with an interest in one of these areas and would ask that you email Joe Roos your willingness to serve.

It's going to be a long winter, so let's make the best of our glorious fall season! ~ **Ted Bennett**

FISHING BAY YACHT CLUB - BOARD MEETING

Highlights from the September Board Meeting.

REAR COMMODORE:

TREASURER – Financials are being updated and will be forwarded to all Board members in the next couple of weeks.

DOCKS CHAIR – The new lift is fully operational and there was no damage to the docks due to last weekend's storm.

SOCIAL CHAIR – Reported the following:

1. Oyster Roast (aka Offshore Closing Day) October 29th:

- Format is open to everyone NOT just offshore racers - invite your family and friends
- Plan includes many bushels of oysters, sides, volunteers in the kitchen and a keg
- Nominal charge to attend
- Registration will be open soon

2. Commodore's Ball is scheduled for November 12th:

- Commonwealth Club reserved
- Working through menu options similar to 2015
- Alex Crain band will perform at this event with a "Motown" and dance-worthy set

GROUNDS CHAIR –

1. Grounds: We're rethinking the scope of the sod project. A plan to create a seasonal Optimist storage point to corral the influx of Junior Race Team Optimist will provide temporary storage along the east side pool fence. Approximate cost for this is \$2000, including the cost of renting a bobcat to remove the grass. Target time for this effort is September/October. The grass we remove for the Opti project would then be repurposed and installed in an area at the back of the Main Clubhouse adjacent to the Opti ramp. Projects also include the trimming the hedge in front of Fannie's, over-seed the campus and limb removal.

2. Barn: New gates are on order and will be installed this fall.

3. Clean-Up Day: Fall Clean-Up Day is scheduled for November 19th.

The Nominating Committee met and most positions are filled for 2017; this Committee will have one more meeting to finalize nominations.

WEB MASTER – Django Registration ready to launch soon. We would like to launch it to replace Zope for as many September and October events as possible and have it perfected for the 2017 season. Registration will occur on the Django website - new.fbyc.net and they will be required to log in there to register. This fiscal year, \$8,300 of \$10,000 budget has been spent as follows:

- 1. User-Profile Merge** - \$3,014 - behind the scenes work that had to be done
- 2. Django Registration** - \$4,370
- 3. Other stuff fixed** - \$916 - mostly Zope issues

MARKETING – All new signs are in Deltaville and will be put up in the next couple of weeks.

YAM CHAIR – YAM would like to have an event using the Club J/24 as soon as it is available for Club Member use. A Happy Hour is being planned for late October.

VICE COMMODORE –

FLEET CAPTAIN – A flag inventory has been done and everything looks to be in good shape. A final inventory will be done at the end of the season.

OFFSHORE DIV CDR. – Resources from last weekend's cancelled regatta will be reviewed and resourced to other upcoming events. Report/inventory will be forthcoming.

ONE DESIGN DIV. CDR – There were three events last month. AOD hosted 98 boats – Feedback from event will be passed on for next year. Two events coming up. Laser needs race committee.

JUNIOR DIV. CDR –

1. Race Teams & Development Teams: Summer racing teams ended racing after the AOD on August 15. We are in the process of closing out financials. Developing fall/winter schedule, and expect FBYC sailors to participate in 10 regattas.

Beginning planning for 2017 season including identification of key volunteers and coaches. Exploring partnership with Christ Church to co-brand a summer 420 team.

2. Junior Week/Opti Kids: Beginning planning for 2017

3. Awards: Forming Junior Awards Committee for 2017 annual awards

PROTEST CHAIR – Three protests from AOD; all were resolved.

TROPHIES – On track for all trophies. Good feedback on the new glasses/trophies. Continuing work on Perpetual Trophies for Annual Awards.

MINUTES

REGATTA COMMITTEE – Costs/income are being reviewed from last weekend's cancelled regatta.

ADULT SAILING PROGRAM – There are four women-captained boats ready for next weekend's sail. Planning on hosting a workshop on how to rig the new Club boats. On an unrelated note, those who have an opinion, please write to the Middlesex Board of Supervisors regarding the boat tax.

OLD BUSINESS:

Matt Braun reported that the Boat Committee met in May. The committee ordered a survey and inspection of *Mr. Roberts*, and that was done in June. The inspection stated that *Mr. Roberts* was in over-all good condition and got good reviews, and assigned the following values: \$40,000/fair market value and \$425,000 replacement value. This Committee is considering the inspection results and will make a recommendation based on their findings.

Vice Commodore, David Lennarz reported that the Deltaville Water System project has been delayed indefinitely due to fears of cost over-runs. Deposits are being returned to those who had signed up to subscribe to this service. Stove Point Improvement Association and FBYC have requested, and been granted, a meeting with the Middlesex Water Authority to discuss further options including a possible pilot program for a water project.

David also reported that the second docks presentation was held at the Club. Approximately 25 members attended and good feedback was given. A Richmond based meeting is scheduled for November 10th – after the next Board Meeting. A pdf version of the presentation is being posted to the website.

The following FBYC committees made their presentations to the Board:

1. Long Range Planning Committee: This committee has now concluded the first phase of its investigations. Details of recommendations are included in this issue of the log.

- Next steps include creating the new positions via Board approval, appointing a search committee to screen applicants for the General Manager role and presenting final budget to the Finance Committee.

A motion was made to adopt the recommendation of the Long Range Planning Committee; this was seconded and approved by the Board.

2. Membership Initiative Task Force: This committee found the following challenges with the current membership:

- Membership aging – need further membership growth
- Juniors aging out of the program
- Economic status (lack of restaurants/lodging) in Deltaville
- Potential increase in Initiation Fees/Dues
- Likelihood of significant decline in membership and, with that, a loss of income

The committee identified the following:

- Objectives:
 - Improve retention and recruitment of members
 - Maintain vibrant, growing sailing community
- Strategy:
 - Promote value of membership and enhance sense of members ownership in FBYC
 - Communicate benefits and accessibility of FBYC to a broader audience
 - Address shifting needs of club membership and appeal to interest of prospective members – especially younger singles and families.
 - Refine/modify existing club programs and structure and develop new ones
 - Increase /broaden active participation in social and water-front activities
 - Address challenges/opportunities inherent in being a “destination” Club
- Proposed Initiatives:
 - New member focus group. To survey potential new members to guide other initiatives and form future plans.
 - Member communication. To enhance content and avenues for delivering message of FBYC membership value to current and prospective members. Focus on social media.
 - Food and beverage service. Keep members at the Club, increase interaction between broader membership.
 - Housing. Identify housing options for sailors and improve attractiveness to non-boat/house owners.
 - Social and waterfront. Enhance value members obtain from Club and bring FBYC to potential new members.
- Recommendations:
 - Set-up subcommittee (three to five members)

with Chair) for each initiative

- Start new member focus group with delivery in December 2016
- Remaining sub-committees to bring recommendation/implementation plan and priorities by April 2017
- Responsibility for executing the proposal as accepted, rests with the Secretary and Membership Chair with accountability to the Board.

The Board approved that the Membership Initiative Task Force move forward on their recommendations.

3. Review and Revision of the Current Club Constitution and By-Laws:

- Submitted copies of the current Constitution with recommended updates, most of which are minor. This is still a work in progress, and they will have final suggestions on what changes to adopt at the next meeting.
- Articles will have to have final approval at the Annual Meeting and 25-day notice will need to be given.
- The bylaws will also be reviewed at the next meeting.
- Board recommended a review of the current Rules, as well.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Trophy Committee has been formed. Members: Tracy Schwarzschild, Jon Deutsch, Bob Fleck, Doug Bendura, Geoff Cahill and the Flag.

NEW CLUB MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE

In the 12 years since construction of the new Clubhouse, FBYC has continued to expand both its physical size and scope of programs. We have almost doubled our footprint, increased substantially the number of stored boats and trailers, hosted more regional and national events, opened our clubhouse to private rental for members, and grown our Junior Division into a flagship youth training program for the Chesapeake Bay that holds events year round. All this has placed greater responsibilities, and sometimes stress, on both our member volunteers and paid staff. We have grown and matured as a club, and it is now time to create a staffing structure that meets the needs of that growth and provides improved members' services.

To this end, your Officers and Board voted to split the current Operations Manager role into two distinct positions of General Manager and Maintenance Supervisor.

We are very fortunate that our current Operations Manager, Dixon Cole has agreed to fill the role as Maintenance Supervisor. Dixon has served FBYC faithfully

for almost 12 years and will bring his vast knowledge of Fishing Bay Yacht Club's facilities to this position.

The General Manager role is a new position for which we will solicit applications. We will hopefully have a new person on board by January 1, 2017. Our General Manager will be responsible for all member and guest services. He or she will work with the Flag and Board to facilitate the operation of all FBYC programs and events, including staffing, communications, member relations, and coordination of member use of club assets.

We are very excited about this evolution and look forward to providing the best services and value to our members. The Flag Officers and I thank Dixon Cole for his support and willingness to adapt to this new structure during the implementation phase ahead.

NEW EVENT REGISTRATION

NEW EVENT REGISTRATION SYSTEM by Strother Scott

By the time you read this, we should have dropped our 15-year-old Zope Event Registration System and replaced it with a new system that operates on our Django web site at <https://new.fbyc.net>. We have been working toward this important switch for several years, and have slowly achieved steps along the way that have enabled us to launch it. The change means many of the technical issues that you may have seen over the years (zope errors, inability for some of you to stay logged in) should go away.

When you see the new registration system, you will notice it looks and works much more like modern online shopping cart. You will find a multi-step process where you will **Submit Personal Data, Submit Boat, Submit Items** to buy, if any, and finally you will be asked to review the data before you **Submit Final Registration**. It will go almost as quickly because the data will frequently be auto filled in advance. And if there is a payment, we will be replacing PayPal with a system from www.stripe.com.

The webpages you will see should be self explanatory, but maybe the diagrams shown nearby may give you some insight into the New Registration Process. You will submit data as you go through three or four steps. Each page will have brief instructions at the top, and a Submit button at the bottom. On the last page, Review Registration, you can see any errors and make corrections by clicking back to Personal Data or Boat Info.

If the event has items to buy, after you **Submit Final Registration**, you will be taken to a Payment Page, and when you click **Pay with Card**, a small FBYC Registration Fees window will open, and there you enter your email and card data. Stripe will process the card and the window will display a Green Check Mark on successful payment and close and confirm completion. In the Stripe system, FBYC never sees any of your credit card data – that little window uses JavaScript to securely transmit card details from browsers to Stripe. Stripe is a San Francisco company owned by investors Sequoia Capital, Andreessen Horowitz, and PayPal co-founders Peter Thiel, and Elon Musk. Our web experts all agreed the switch to Stripe was a good idea.

One major difference is the new system requires you to log into a different website than www.fbyc.net in order to

register. Many of you have never done that, but it is the same site where you register for new user credentials or reset your password. If you visit <https://new.fbyc.net> and are not logged in – you will see a link to Login in Help - <https://new.fbyc.net/help/logging-in/> on the red bar. It is a little cheat sheet that tries to explain it and answer questions.

It has been a pleasure to work on this project for a long time now, and I sure hope it serves us all well for years to come.

ANNUAL ONE DESIGN REGATTA RECAP

The 77th edition of the Annual One Design Regatta was certainly a hot one with 102 boats and a heat index approaching 20 degrees more than that at times. Most of the racing was completed on Saturday in 8-15 knots of wind with Sunday's racing starting with winds around 11 and dying out as the day progressed.

The 23 boat Flying Scot was won by John Kreidler of Western Carolina Sailing Club, 2nd Rob Whittemore of FBYC and 3rd Sean O'Donnell of NC Community Sailing.

A 12-boat Laser Radial fleet that was an all-FBYC affair with (1) Garrett Levy, (2) Trent Levy and (3) Gannon Troutman.

An 11-boat Laser Standard fleet won by James Jacob followed by his son Alex Jacob and 3rd was FBYC's Alain Vincey.
