FISHING BAY YACHT CLUB - BOARD MEETING January 14, 2021 – Via Zoom

SECRETARY – **Geoffrey D. Cahill**: Section 3 of the By-Laws states that the Board shall once a year elect into Family membership the member's children who attained age 10 during the preceding calendar year. Our records indicate that nine member's children turned 10 last year. Motion Made and Approved.

TREASURER – K. Stuart Gregory:

- Rounded up the last of the fiscal 2020 payment and reimbursement requests. Thanks to all those who dutifully signed their payment request forms and included copies of their invoices! Please keep up that effort in the New Year.
- 2. Processed the relatively few payments for December.

- 3. Continued to work toward bookkeeper conversion old bookkeeper finished on Dec 11th except for issuing W-9's. New bookkeepers are in place and getting up to speed.
- 4. Located several missing W-9's and forwarded to the old bookkeeper.
- 5. Made the first payment to Meeco Sullivan for the Middle Dock project.

HOUSE CHAIR – Kenneth Johnson:

- Progress on the mold remediation and repairs to the Clubhouse ceiling has been delayed by difficulty scheduling a date when Arthur Wilton can begin.
- Brian has offered to use Club employee manpower to place the protective plywood on the floor where the scaffolding will be erected. Arthur has agreed to supply the plywood and he expects to be able to begin the project perhaps as early as late January.
- I have noted several issues of deficiency and noncompliance regarding building additions and improvements.
- I would like to request that we implement a policy of consulting a licensed professional when all plumbing, electrical or HVAC repairs or additions are contemplated. This policy will result in the most cost effective, reliable, compliant and safest outcome.

DOCKS CHAIR – David Hinckle:

- As of today, all slips are leased and we have a large waiting list. I have not received notification from any member indicating they will not renew their lease.
- We have 12 boats on the waiting list and roughly half of them are over 40 feet long.
- Brian has scheduled the annual inspection of the hoist to occur in the next month or so.

SOCIAL CHAIR – Gary and Karen Akens:

We are meeting with Carrie Russell to review prior year activities and any documentation she may have available for us. Currently we are looking at plans for five social events:

- 1. Opening Day April 17, 2021
- 2. Memorial Day Open House/Raft-up May 30, 2021
- 3. July 4th Cookout July 4, 2021
- 4. Closing Day Oyster Roast November 6, 2021
- 5. Commodore's Ball November 13, 2021

The viability of in-person events vs. virtual vs. some hybrid will be guided and determined by the Covid-19 situation.

GROUNDS CHAIR – Steve H. Montgomery: Offseason projects:

· We demolished the old set of lockers behind the

dumpsters; they were in very poor shape and can't be rehabilitated; replacement will be driven by the need for more.

- We are repairing the fence on the east property line; the neighbor has offered to share the costs. Brian and Ben will provide labor.
- Brian will begin cleaning out the barn of unneeded material so we can assess the floors that will need repair.
- We will remove the recycling dumpster for the winter months to save \$150/month. It is not used at this time of year; we will return it before the spring rush.
- We are considering alternatives to repair/improve the bottom of the grass ramp so the children will have an easier time pulling their trailers from the beach to the ramp if we can fix the transition. Allen Mason will be lead on this.... thanks to Allen!
- Brian and I are developing a plan and cost/revenue analysis on expanding the Laser Lot in front of the Club House. We think there is a demand for more spaces and the cost of expansion will be minor.
- Elizabeth has asked me to evaluate the need for a bike rack near the pool. If anyone has any input please feel free to call or email me; it would be helpful.

LONG RANGE PLANNING – James L. Raper:

- Jan: Evaluate previously identified initiatives to continue as long-range need.
- Jan-Feb.: Establish committee of 4-6 folks representing broad perspective within the Club
- Mar-April: Committee develops straw man long range initiatives
- May-June: Validate long range planning focus with Board
- June-July: Validate long range requirements with every member survey
- Sept: Publish consolidated 2021 Comprehensive Long-Range Plan
- Oct-Dec: Set five-year roadmap for identified initiative, approved by the board, communicated to membership.

Yudkin: This month I plan to use the 2020 Membership Feedback Survey and FBYC membership applications to help fellow committee chairs field interest and increase participation for their respective events etc.

2021 Vision and Goals:

The YAMs will be reaching out to local schools (CNU, UVA, William and Mary and VT) via personal connections. If anyone has any contacts, they are willing to assist with or connect me with please let me know.

FLEET CAPTAIN – **C. Mayo Tabb**: Participation and declining Fleets is of concern at the Club and Bay wide. I have posted three documents from the PHRF annual Delegates meeting that addresses that subject and reports what are the trends in the Northern Bay. I believe these will migrate south and we need to be prepared.

The middle of the fleet is being hollowed out and we need to bring more boats out on the racecourse. Taking the Annapolis experience and applying it to FBYC we have at the top of the A and B/C classes boats that have the latest carbon and technora Black sails, sprayed and wet sanded bottoms, diver cleaned before every race and regular experienced crews who will win almost all the top finishes but are showed up when even better prepared boats from up North show up at Stingray Regatta. A casual racer is usually simply racing for the back of the fleet.

To appeal to the more casual racer PHRF introduced the Corinthian Class several years ago but it did not become

widely if at all adapted. In the past years CRCA has come out of the Northern end of the Bay to appeal to those racers. Itys offering is still very limited but as shown on the Participation chart where it was offered gained between 25 and 60% of all entries! The Northern Bay Leukemia Cup was 42% CRCA!

The ORC which is primarily pushed by the Annapolis Yacht Club is primarily for the gold plater top end boats and I don't see it migrating to FBYC.

With declining numbers, we need to expand our fleet to get more boats out on the course. The PHRF Non-Spin and the PHRF Corinthian and CRCA appeal to the same group with the latter two potentially being able to expand our participation. We need to start thinking that the future might be the PHRF A and B/C or possibly a single PHRF class for those that invest in the latest race prep for their boats and the PHRF Corinthian/CRCA for the more casual racers and do away with PHRF Non-Spinnaker.

OFFSHORE DIV. RACE CHAIR - Edward O'Connor:

As of today, 13 PRO positions have been filled for offshore races. I also have 3 definite "maybes".

I currently have 4 "open" positions and I have sent emails/ texts to specific members and I am awaiting responses.

Summary

With 20 offshore races on our Sailing Events spreadsheet, I feel confident about 16 of them. That leaves a balance of 4 events not spoken for. Of the 4, 1 is the St. Mary's Cup event on August 6 and there is an open question as to its future. I'll target, at the latest, mid-February to complete filling all positions.

On a separate tack, I've contacted Katie Yudkin, Membership Engagement Chair, and discussed/via email, the possibility of encouraging new members, or potential new members, to participate in selected offshore race activities. We agreed that a good way to start might be to invite interested folks to join race committees on Mr. Roberts, or on chase boats, as "observers". No skills required. This would be a great way to introduce folks to FBYC racing. Ideally, get on a boat, enjoy the bay, have a few laughs, eat a sandwich, enjoy a social and see what it's all about. This might be a good feeder program to populate crew training efforts as well as crewing. More to follow.

February 24, 2021

Winter Program with Dave Tabor and Carol Vaughn titled "How to Sail Around the World on Other People's Boats." Dave and Carol are new members who spent six months crewing in the latest Oyster Round the World Rally. This will be a Wednesday evening Zoom event from 7-8 PM.

March

Expanding on Jerry Latell's previous highly successful **Sail Trim** Seminars, we are preparing a three-week series of Zoom seminars.

- Week One: FBYC Introduction: Who we are, where
 we sail and What we do. Program chairs including
 (but not limited to) Juniors, Cruising, FBYC Sailing
 School, Women's Sailing Clinic, Racing and Social will
 all contribute to the discussion.
- Week Two: More detailed discussion on racing and cruising programs with specific invitations on how to become involved.
- Week Three: Jerry's discussion on both cruising sails and racing sails. Broad discussion on sail trim and how to make boats go...leading into:

March/April

- Crew Training Seminars being developed similar to last year's online offering.
- "Launch" the rebranding of the FBYC Adult Sailing School highlighting the Women's Clinic. The Adult Sailing chairs are currently expanding their offerings and this effort will support them.

May

Become a **Deltaville Dealer Days** sponsor (\$100) which includes a presence in all advertising and signage. This is NOT a single site event. It's a general Open House at multiple yacht dealer locations. This year, it is being opened up to include yacht brokers and used boat sellers.

Suggest FBYC hold a **"Boatload Boat-Yard Sale"** to capitalize on increased retail presence in Dates are May 1-2 from 10AM-4PM. Only FBYC members can reserve a "table" for a nominal fee which can then be donated to a local nonprofit. We can stipulate this is only for resale among members or open it up to a larger audience. A membership table would also be staffed. Brian has necessary staff to help. Suggest just a 10-12 AM window on either May 1 or May 2.

ADULT SAILING PROGRAM – **Mike S. Toms** and **Ronald Q. Jenkins**:

The COVID Effect- Could boost adult sailing

We believe with proper branding, the adult sailing program can attract and serve additional folks seeking rewarding outdoor activities in COVID conscious settings.

Branding & Publicity

Karen Soule called for a "data dump" of the Adult Sailing Program as it exists, and will spearhead our "branding" initiative. She believes, as do Mike Toms and I, that our Club boats and Sailing school are a powerful tool for attracting new (and younger) members.

Club Regatta, Portsmouth & B Fleet Promotion

This has been a primary adult sailing focus in the past year. We need volunteers to take this to the next level in 2021, working in concert with Karen Soule's marketing initiative.

Club Boat Update

We continue to streamline our processes, to make reserving and using a Club boat and/or register for Sailing School classes as easy as possible.

Stay tuned for updated on-line registration process, and other improvements.

Adult Sailing School

Watch for updates and details on FBYC.net. We have four volunteer coaches and plans to serve members and prospective members in 2021.

CBYRA DELEGATE – Thomas J. Roberts: Donna and I have completed and submitted our directory of officers on CBYRA's form and I submitted our <u>preliminary</u> schedule for inclusion in the Green book. We will follow-up with the final schedule. I believe Joe Roos is sharing those with Lin McCarthy for the Region 4 PHRF schedule.

MINUTES / SPECIAL NOTICES

This is underway for CBYRA members. Several rules changes are being discussed. This is the first of **20 webinars planned**. #5 is a rules Q&A on Thursday Feb 4. These are recorded so you can see them any time.

One thing RCs need to know is that **the rules now only recognize the <u>hull</u> when crossing the starting line or finish line**. A boat's bowsprit, spinnaker or person on a trapeze are not over until the hull is over. Hull is not defined so for Wasps, 49ers and Moths we need to refer to their class rules.

US Sailing Racing rules are being published as an App, free for members. It can be searched, has a fillable protest form and includes the Appeals book. Paper copies are available at the US Sailing store at a reduced price for US Sailing members.

DOCKS PHASE 2 JANUARY UPDATE FIRST STEPS TAKEN!

FBYC has taken an important step towards the upcoming replacement of the Jackson Creek Middle Dock over the winter of 2021-22. On January 7th, the Board held a meeting and approved a motion authorizing making a refundable deposit towards constructing floating dock modules, with vendor Meeco-Sullivan.

This motion saved the Club roughly \$11,000 by avoiding upcoming pricing increases due to shortening supplies of materials used in the module construction. It also secures the Club's construction slot, which helps to ensure that we will be able to complete the project on schedule.

Meet Board Member: Historian George Burke by Karen Soule

Even though "real sailors" are still out on the Chesapeake's waters, many of us spend the winter to regroup, work on boats and plan for the next sailing season. So now's a good time to share some stories about your board of directors, especially for new members.

We start with our Club Historian, George Burke.



George, wisely, embraced his wife Lyon's, childhood love of sailing. Lyons had sailed at the Hampton Yacht Club as a junior, but George didn't step aboard a sailboat until he was 40 years old. Long-term FBYC member Tony Sakowski, invited him to crew on a one design boat and taught him the fundamentals of sailing. They soon became members, initially to teach their two children to sail and develop their sailing chops. Fast forward a few years and many nautical miles under the keel, from Maine to the Caribbean, George and Lyons now cruise aboard their Sabre 426, S/V Reveille.

A pulmonologist by training and graduate of Richmond's Medical College of Virginia, FBYC is grateful to count on George's medical advice-not to mention his ability to spin a great sailing yarn and whistle up a tune on the east dock!

They both value FBYC for many life-long friendships. And we value them for serving.



In Memoriam FBYC Honors the Life of Beloved Community Leader: Norton Hurd



Norton Warren Hurd, 104, of Deltaville, passed away at home on Friday, January 8, 2021. Norton was born on September 15, 1916.

Norton was a star athlete in baseball, basketball and tennis at Lynchburg College. He graduated in 1938 and was inducted

into the Lynchburg College Sports Hall of Fame in 1995. Hurd taught and coached at Amelia High School until August 1941, when he enlisted in the U.S. Navy. Following being a flight instructor, Lt. Hurd flew dive bombing and fighter missions in the Pacific from the USS Wasp and was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

He returned to Deltaville and started Hurd's Home Appliances, which became Hurd's Hardware. Norton was beloved by the community, visitors and customers, making everyone feel welcome with his warmth, wit and willingness to help. Norton was a dedicated community leader, helping found the Lower Middlesex Volunteer Fire Department, Middlesex County Volunteer Rescue Squad, Deltaville Community Association and Middlesex County Lions Club.

Norton served Philippi Christian Church as a deacon, elder, Sunday school teacher and board chairman. He

served on the Board of Bank of Middlesex and was a past chairman of First Virginia Bank, Middle Peninsula. Norton played baseball for the Deltaville Deltas for three decades and was a "hit" at the Old Timers ball games. Regarding golf, he said it got easier to shoot his age the closer he got to 100.

Norton was beloved by Hurd's Hardware staff and customers, working up to age 101. Norton's heroism and service were read into the Congressional record in 2006. He received numerous acknowledgements in Middlesex, and was one of only two persons awarded the University of Lynchburg's community service "Beacon of Excellence" award. Norton will be remembered for his kindness, charity, service, wit and as a wonderful person.

He was predeceased by his parents, Jesse Hurd and Mabel Norton Hurd. He is survived by his children, Myra Hurd Wall, Jack Hurd (Denise), Michael Hurd (Beth); grandchildren, Amy (Holly White), Jon Hurd (Katy), Madeline Hurd and Carter Hurd; great-grandchildren, Maggie Hurd and Henry Hurd. Graveside services only were held at Philippi Memorial Gardens on Ballpark Road in Deltaville on Thursday, January 14, 2021.
