It is already August and we are halfway through the 2022 season. Members are out at the Club, and out on the water. Sailing is in full swing at FBYC.

Our Junior sailors have been

very active around the Club. After a very successful Junior Week and Junior Regatta, it is great to see all the Optis, ILCAs and C420s out sailing in Fishing Bay. The race teams are taking their skills on the road competing across the Bay and beyond. Also, the recent Sea Breeze Regatta saw a very competitive 5 boat M15 fleet, all with FBYC junior sailors!

The Cruising group has been hitting the Bay, with a good number of skippers and crew enjoying the July 4th Cruise and the cruise south to Norfolk. The One Design and Offshore sailors are deep into their summer racing. The One Design sailors had their first Summer Seabreeze canceled due to weather. A good-sized fleet distributed across Flying Scots, Melges 15s and ILCAs registered for the Seabreeze 2 and enjoyed what turned into a spectacular day of racing. This month will see the ILCA sailors mixing it up in the ILCA Summer 2. In the Offshore Division, both the Cut Channel and the Delta Dash were raced in July with two more Long Distance events on the calendar in coming months.

There has been growing participation in the new Cruising Class for offshore races. I should note that the competition remains fierce among these Cruising Class racers for the FBYC Challenge Cup, awarded this year to the Cruising Class boat with most boat days on the water in FBYC sponsored race events. There is plenty of time

to stake your claim on this prestigious award, so register and race with your friends. If you have any questions contact Offshore Division Commander, Bob Fleck or Fleet Captain. Mayo Tabb.

The Club offers programs for sailors of all levels to hone their skills and gain new experiences. The Sailing School, under the direction of our Waterfront Director, Amanda Almany, offers instruction for adults and juniors. The Adult Sail Training Day enjoyed a good turnout with sailors going through the land-based activities as high winds forced cancellation of the on-the-water work. The Women's Clinic will have just wrapped up as you are reading this. This clinic offers support for both the beginner and racing sailors. Due to the efforts of the volunteers and with a record number of registrations in 2022 from member and nonmember sailors alike, I anticipate it was another very successful event.

As the summer draws to a close, we embrace August at FBYC with events that can appeal to the desires of almost every sailor. The month kicks off with the Jere Dennison Legacy Regatta. Jere served in FBYC leadership roles for over 40 years and influenced generations of sailors. Initially the regatta, of which Jere was one of the founders, was affectionately coined the "Geezer Regatta" and is now dedicated to his memory. This is a regatta for skippers who have passed their sixtieth birthday and as Jere quoted from Rime of the Ancient Mariner in a 2011 Event Notice, with apologies to Samuel Taylor Coleridge, "I esteem you, ancient Geezer! And your skillful helmsman's hand!"

The 83rd Annual One Design Regatta is set for mid-August. This is one of FBYC signature events and delivers competitive racing, fun and camaraderie. The AOD is also the Flying Scot Atlantic Coast Championship, so we expect many of the class's top sailors to be in attendance. The Friday evening before AOD, Adult Sailing is sponsoring another wonderful opportunity for all racers,

both seasoned and new. The Race Rule Clinic with Jerry Thompson will address rules and tactics for situations you may encounter on the course. This promises to be an insightful session for all racing classes, not just the One Design. Come out, bring your friends.

The widely popular Wee Dram to Cape Charles is all set for the last Friday of the month with a near record number of boats already registered. The event start covers three days. Skippers and crew just need to be sure they are present for the dockside social and contest on Saturday evening.

Also, just around the corner is the Stingray Point Regatta, FBYC's premiere Offshore sailing event of the season. Starting on Friday of Labor Day weekend, sailors will experience a medium distance race around government marks. Saturday and Sunday feature courses for PHRF racing with the Cruising Class competing on government mark courses.

There will be plenty of activity at the Club and on the water this month so spend your time on the Bay at FBYC. Get involved today, volunteer for an activity, get out on the water - and invite a friend to share in the excitement at FBYC.

TREASURER & FINANCE – **K. Stuart Gregory & Veronica Hinkle**: Update on the new reimbursement/payment request process:

New process: Go to the FBYC web site and log in. Click the Member tab at the top of the page and look for the second entry labeled **Expense Reimbursements**. Click on that link and follow the instructions. This is a Google based program and it requires you to have a Google account. An email address is sufficient. So far, the feedback has been very positive – it is much easier to use than the old system.

The old system still works - if you prefer that, or have difficulty with the new system, you can revert to that. Developments soon to come:

- The ability to be paid by ACH vs. a paper check in the mail. When a reimbursement request is made, our bookkeeper has the ability to arrange for the payee to be paid electronically through the ACH system vs. a paper check. If you would like to make arrangements to have expenses reimbursed that way, please let me know at the time you submit the reimbursement request. The bookkeeper will send you an email from Intuit – the parent company of Quicken. In that email, you'll find instructions on how to enter your bank info. The system will tell you what day to expect payment - usually in 3-4 business days. Once you are set up for ACH payments, you will not need to re-enter your info for subsequent payments. Make sure to enter your bank info carefully as the system does not ask you to review it or enter it a second time before it is submitted.
- Currently, when a member submits a reimbursement request, it is forwarded to the appropriate person(s) for their approval (IE Junior commander, Offshore Commander, Social Chair, etc.). It then comes to the Treasurer and I add the appropriate Expense Code. Each expense is categorized and there's an Expense Code for each category. Soon, this process will be streamlined and the person approving the expense will also be able to add the appropriate Expense Code. This should be simple as there are only a few Expense Codes for each "approver" to use in some cases, just one! This will speed up the payment process and help those who are responsible for a budget to have a better understanding of where that budget stands throughout the year.

OLD BUSINESS:

Review/Revise Bylaws: At the July Board meeting, the Board was asked to review the Bylaws considering the need to simplify and clarify Board responsibilities and support both daily/annual club operation and strategic planning.

Discussion: Several comments and suggestions were received before the Board meeting. These were reviewed

and Board held further discussion. Suggestions, comments, and observations are summarized below.

Organization worked well for long time but challenges with 95% volunteer and constant turnover. The volunteer part is a huge net benefit.

Good communication is a challenge between incoming and outgoing board and committee chairs.

These positions should not be a one-year role as the learning curves are too steep. First year in position playing catch-up from day one. Consider two-year commitment for Trustee - The first year, you serve as Associate, the second as full role/position. Also, some description in Bylaws inaccurate, obsolete.

Several people noted the Board was too large and encouraged a reduction in Board members, perhaps over time Commander/Trustee serve on the Board, concentrate on longer range planning, budgeting, developing future section leaders, serve as a consultant on the tough issues and then represent at the Board level. Focus of Committees Chairs to run the day-to-day operations of the organization.

Commodore Joseph W. Roos proposed four areas to focus a review.


- 1. Roles, continuity and strategic support for Flag, Trustees
- 2. Finance/risk responsibilities Treasurer, Finance Chair. Finance Committee
- 3. Role and Function of Committees Chairs Ensure continuity, clarify and consolidate functions as appropriate
- 4. Procedures, Consistency and Membership

It was noted that over the last couple of years, several initiatives have been undertaken to address some of these areas. Including the new reimbursement system, Long Range Plan process, clarifying responsibilities of different positions in the Sailing Divisions, and consolidating Committee Chairs.

Small committees are being formed to assess each of the four areas and bring recommendations and an outline of any proposed revision to the August Board meeting.

DINGHY AND OPTI RACK RENTALS

The Flag has asked that the Dinghy and Opti Racks be better managed. The Grounds Chair has responsibility for both and works closely with the Club Manager and Club Executive Secretary to better meet members' needs. The following outlines the program; and we ask for members' support.

Spaces on both racks are for lease to members who desire to keep their dinghy, Opti, kayak or paddle board on site.

- Members desiring to rent a space may contact the Club Manager, Executive Secretary or Grounds Chair to see if a space is available. A waiting list will be maintained if no spaces are available and will be on a first come, first served basis. Rentals are monthto-month with no notice required to leave. Members desiring a different space should be sure his wishes are known by being on the waiting list for that desired space.
- 2. Spots are assigned to a member and reserved for their use only. The spaces will be empty some of the time, however they are not open to anyone else to use. Each spot will be labeled with the member's name and FBYC assigned tag number. FBYC has the right to rearrange spaces to best meet the needs of most members; reasonable notice of any FBYC initiated moves will be provided as a courtesy.

- 3. Members must provide the description, hull number, name, and state registration, if these exist, for their boat upon renting the space. A Club number sticker will be placed on the boat to assist with identification.
- 4. Boats not registered will be removed from the racks after a reasonable effort is made to identify the owner to discuss rental options.
- 5. The Executive Secretary will maintain FBYC records of who is where and tag numbers with the assistance of the Grounds Chair and Club Manager. She will maintain the charges and bills for the rental.
- 6. Accessories such as dollies, paddles, etc. may only be stored in the rented space; they may not be left behind the racks, on adjacent fences or buildings. Members' names should be put on all accessories. Motors should not be stored in or on the racks due to the lack of security.
- 7. Kayaks, paddle boards may only use the side racks; if space on the main racks are available they may rent those only if there are no members who need dinghy or Opti space for their boat. If a member needs that space for an Opti or Dinghy, the kayak renter must move to the kayak rack or leave.
- 8. Flag has directed that boats in Club spaces must be maintained in good working order. Derelict, dirty and poorly maintained boats will be removed by the Club Manager after reasonable notice is provided to the member. Dinghies should be maintained in an inflated state to prevent water and debris from collecting on them; covers are recommended.
- Staff will keep a general oversight of the racks during hazardous weather, but the member is responsible for securing his boat. Staff will not secure boats or protect them.
- 10. FBYC assumes no responsibility for any Club members' boat or accessories in a member rented space on the racks. Members should ensure their insurance coverage extends to the rented space.

JERE DENNISON REGATTA



JERE DENNISON LEGACY REGATTA SATURDAY, AUGUST 6, 2022



This event is held to honor Jere Dennison who served in FBYC leadership roles for over 40 years. While his achievements with the Club are too numerous to mention, he was the Club's youngest Commodore, created the Club's comprehensive Austin Memorial Library, and was Club Historian for over 15 years. Jere was an avid

one-design sailor who completely understood that sailing is a lifelong adventure - an ancient legacy to be passed on from generation to generation!

This regatta is a one-day event for Flying Scots, Classic Boats, and one design classes having three or more entries by skippers 60 years of age or older. All skippers will compete in the 60 years and older age group. Additionally, skippers 70 years of age or older can compete for the Vintage Skipper Award. This award is

designated as a first place overall finish award for the age 70 or older skipper in each boat class. Seventy years and older skippers must designate their Vintage Award eligibility on the event entry form during the Regatta Network sign up process. Skippers or crew will not be required to be members of FBYC. The crew may be any age but may not take the tiller during races, except during an emergency, or the boat is subject to protest and may be disqualified.

The Classic Division is open to any Classic boat design of 25' length or under at the waterline. The Portsmouth Yardstick DPN Handicap System will be used to score finishes in the Classic Division.



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
