A subsequent visit by the whole family confirmed that they all thought this was a unique and special place, and one they would love to become a part of. Paul attended sailing camp at Mystic Seaport in Connecticut for multiple summers as a teenager, learning small boat handling and racing, as well as crewing on cruising courses on their large schooner. As a young adult, he crewed multiple times on friends' boats on the Bay, in Florida, and in the islands, and also barefoot chartered three times on the Bay out of Rock Hall, MD. Paul subsequently renovated and lived on a fully operational 34' houseboat in DC for three years – while the houseboat admittedly lacked sails. he learned a ton about seamanship and maintenance (and fiberglass!) during those years.

Paul and Sophie had not expected to necessarily become part of a community via a boat purchase, but are very appreciative of the opportunity to do that at FBYC, especially one that seems very family friendly – they love that the kids may find friends there and also be able to start their own sailing experiences through the various programs. Alex and Karen Scott - Henrico, VA - Alex's father and his father were experienced ocean and bay sailors. He learned some portion of his father's sea sense growing up in Annapolis and spent as much time working on their fleet of 16 mostly wood boats as sailing, motoring or rowing them. The fleet was an eclectic collection from an 8-foot Bahama dingy to a 45-foot German Ketch. Included in the fleet at different points in time was a working Skipjack and several Deadrises. His favorite was a 28-foot Sound Interclub that was poetry in motion. He and his now wife (married in 1985) dated on her. His father died in a plane crash in 1979. When he was 22. The fleet was liquidated in subsequent years during which Alex started his multidecade career in commercial banking. Sailing became owning small trailer-able sloops and the occasional charter where he tried somewhat unsuccessfully to pass on the gift of sailing to his children while working in mostly land-locked locations.

Alex and Karen's two children were born in Richmond in 1989 and 1991. They left Richmond in 1999 returning in 2013 purchasing half an Investment Advisory (Alpha Advisors) started by an old banking partner in 2001 and the business has grown nicely. They have 7 grandchildren and wish not to repeat the crime of squandering their sailing heritage. Steve Gillispie's timely reminder of FBYC's existence made Alex see the possibility of getting back to the water, looking for opportunities to shanghai the grandchildren from their parents as allowed and perhaps offer his services to FBYC in whatever capacity would be useful. Alex & Karen's current fleet consists of an international 420 and an Old Town canoe. They enjoy cruising and have chartered 38' - 41' Beneteau and Hunters out of the local Norton Yachts, 34' J-boat out of J-World in Annapolis and a 34' Pearson at the Chesapeake Sailing Club. IN MEMORIAM

George Wayne Anderson May 1, 1927 - November 8, 2022





George Wayne Anderson, age 95, died at home on November 8, 2022. George (also George Wayne) was born on May 1, 1927, in Richmond, Virginia, and was the son of Isabel Scott Anderson and Edward Clifford Anderson. George was predeceased by his wife, Anne, and his sister,

Elisabeth Anderson Bryan. He is survived by a daughter, Cary Randolph "Randy" Anderson Trainor (Tom) of Franconia, NH; and son, Edward Clifford Anderson II (Mary Hoge) of Richmond, VA; five grandchildren; four greatgrandchildren; and his sister, Isabel Anderson Fitzgerald.

George attended St. Christopher's School, Woodberry Forest School and the University of Virginia. Upon graduation, he went to work in New York for Loeb, Rhoades & Co., a Wall Street brokerage firm. Ultimately, he returned to Richmond to work at Anderson & Strudwick. George was a member of The Country Club of Virginia, The Commonwealth Club, Fishing Bay Yacht Club, Fisher's Island Club, the New York Yacht Club and the Cruising Club of America.

George's parents were not Charter Members of Fishing Bay Yacht Club when it was first organized in 1939 as the Urbanna Yacht Club. However, by 1941 when the earliest yearbook available was published, Edward Anderson was listed as a member. Records are not available about "join dates" of any of the Urbanna Yacht Club members who ultimately moved to Deltaville in 1950 and changed the name of the club to Fishing Bay Yacht Club. They all were given 1950 as their "join date." George would have been 23 years of age when the club moved. At the time of his death, George was the last remaining club member with a 1950 join date.

A lifelong sailor, George was never more at home than on his beloved sailboat, *Allons*. He skippered her in numerous Newport-Bermuda and Annapolis-Newport races as well as cruised extensively along the New England Coast. *Allons* was a Sparkman and Stephens designed wooden yawl. Formerly named *Robin*, she had once been the personal yacht of the legendary Ted Hood of Hood Sails. George flew the FBYC burgee in many high-profile ocean races with several FBYC members as regular crew. He wrote articles for The Log recording the racing events that also gave a delightful commentary of the joys, frustrations, and practical aspects of racing an offshore yacht so many decades ago.

George enjoyed singing and music, and he especially loved playing the piano and accordion. He was involved in a variety of theater and musical organizations throughout his life, including the Richmond Musical Theater and Lyric Theater Corp., actively participating in both. George enjoyed performing in many musical productions, which his family fondly remembers from his many hours of practice at the piano and accordion. If there was a piano present at a party or event, George would often make his way to it to entertain the crowd.

Despite losing his sight in one eye as a young boy, this set back never slowed him down. He went on to become an accomplished pilot and ultimately owned his own airplane. Many will remember his flying to visit his parents and friends in Kennebunkport, Maine for the weekend and returning to work on Monday with boxes of live lobsters to the delight of his work colleagues.

George personified determination and perseverance. His family and friends might call this stubbornness but it served him well. He lived life on his terms and let nothing deter him from his objectives. Even advanced age was no obstacle for George. He continued his lifelong passions of skiing, golfing and sailing into his nineties. Despite having a heart attack on the Franconia, N.H. ski slopes five years ago, he returned to ski with his daughter and her family a year later. Just three months before his death, he was playing golf with his beloved Yorkshire Terrier, Winkie, at his side.

A graveside service was held Saturday, November 19, at noon in Hollywood Cemetery.

ILCA MASTERS CHAMPIONSHIP



Fishing Bay Yacht Club hosted 27 sailors in November for the 41st Chesapeake Bay ILCA Masters Championship after postponing from the weekend in October when Hurricane Ian came through. Five races were sailed Saturday in 8-15 knots and another 4 races sailed in 6-11 on Sunday. Both days saw temperatures reach into the 70's with southerly winds which felt much more like mid-September than early November.

James Jacob, Severn Sailing Association (SSA), was the overall winner, picking up the title for the 7th time in the 41 year history of the event. Natalie Burls, SSA, was the top woman. Scott Adam was 2nd overall and was the most consistent on the weekend, winning 4 of the races and the rest being all top 3 aside from one. David Waiting, SSA, won 3 of the races and had only 1 race out of the top 5. Dave was particularly adept at going downwind in the lighter air.

Peter Seidenberg, the top Legend and 4th overall, traveled from Rhode Island, and had a great start on Saturday and was just a few points out of the lead going into day two. Jon Deutsch, the top Fishing Bay Sailor, had a race winner along with some local knowledge around the race course taking him to a 6th place finish and second Apprentice. Rounding the top 5 was Bob Tan, a previous winner of this regatta who sailed consistently and was the top Grand Master.

Rick Klein and his crew on the Race Committee did a marvelous job with the racing and had particularly square lines making the starts even and under the P flag.

A lot of fun was had even though we missed those who could not attend the rescheduled date. **Congratulations** to James and all of the sailors who attended!
