OFFSHORE RACE CHAIR - Edward J. O'Connor:

Current Month Outstanding PRO deliverables:

- We have four Offshore events without a PRO. Included in the events are seven days of racing (without a PRO)
- Applying the two maxims many of us live by, Murphy's Law and the Law of unintended consequences, we have a plethora of PRO candidates who are strapped for time, or are no longer interested

- During our pre-season deliberations, we reduced the number of event weekends, but we didn't reduce the number of overall race days
- Stingray Point Regatta has always been problematical, but, so far, no one is interested in taking it on.
- Taking all the above into account, Plan A should be continue contacting members for PRO positions, but we should also have a plan B. Plan B might include having OS skippers start races (as we do for Winter Series #2 and #3) and have the results forwarded to someone to enter Regatta Network
- Consider hiring someone to run the Stingray Point Regatta.

- Electricians are finishing by April 15th
- Expecting Dominion to complete the new service within 10 days
- After Dominion, we have a final checkout step by our electrical contractor, Luxterra, then electrical will be completed and ready for members to use!

Rear Commodore Doug Bendura touched on the Long-Range Planning Process. Jason Angus sent out a survey to all division commanders regarding the budgets over the next year and long term. Ideally to plan ahead in the planning process instead of a every three to four years. This gives you time over the summer to think about your expenditures for the next year. If you have any questions on the form, please call Jason Angus.

NEW BUSINESS: Commodore Joe Roos discussed the annual club update will be held on Memorial Day, Monday May 30th. The objective is to meet with club members and have a town hall session, Q&A to last about 45 minutes and discuss the following:

- Volunteer support
- Questions

Also, to reach out in advance to our members to see what they would like to hear about our club.

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GROUNDS CHAIR – Stephen Montgomery:

Prior Month Accomplishments:

- Working with the Dock Committee, the bank between the Docks Parking lot and the water was sodded. The effort will be to stabilize the banks, stop the erosion, establish a good grass bed for permanent and improve the attractiveness of the area. The drip areas around the trees are being mulched.
- Held Spring Clean Up on March 26th with 74 members pitching in to beautify the grounds, ready the Club boats for the season and improve Junior Facilities.
- Began improving the Opti Rack. It has been stained and new kayak racks have been added to free up space for Optis. Kayak spaces are priced less than the Opti spaces.

Upcoming activities:

 Water meter install and hook up (April is the most recent information but it is a moving target.). As

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an aside, we have three pressure tanks to maintain operating pressure, regardless of demand, level. They are special fiberglass tanks plumbed into the distribution system. A leak has developed in one of three and it has been taken offline. We suspect we will not need to replace it once the new water system is hooked up but will monitor.

• Opportunities exist to "Adopt-A-Spot" of the grounds to take off for the summer. Large or small, please see me if interested in pitching to keep our grounds beautiful.

The walkway between Fannies and the West Dock is in poor repair. Over the years it has been patched and repaired as the underlining support structure (salt treated runners) has deteriorated. I have asked Brian to estimate a cost to replace; we may be able to do sections over time (1-2 yrs. at the most) as funds allow. More later.

DOCKS CHAIR – David Hinckle:

- At this point we only have one open slip but it is for a very small boat. There are five members on the waiting list now.
- The boats are returning to the middle dock now but there is still a bit of shuffling around needed to get members into their proper slips.
- I am waiting on the quote from another electrician to conduct the electrical repairs on the west dock.
- David Clark and I met with the representative from Meeco Sullivan to discuss options for a floating dock on the Fishing Bay side. He believes they have a solution that will work well given our conditions. Obviously, this is a project for the future, and we will explore all options.

Prior Month Accomplishments:

I have emailed all possible PROs that said they would get back to me but have not yet done so. I included the remaining open dates and said I would be calling them in the coming days.

Current and upcoming activities:

I talked with Ruthanna Jenkins about coordinating possible new PROs to the rotation. The hopes were to get some new interest at the US Sailing Race Management class she set up. Unfortunately, only 5 members attended. I was the only new PRO in training. I was able to get an additional two dates covered, so there are only four open dates as of 4/12/2022.

I'm making another round of calls but I'm starting to get concerned. One of the races not covered is at the end of the month. I need to get these races covered and then start a discussion on implementing a better system to assign races.

CRUISING COMMANDER – Scott Sirles:

The Cruising Division kicked off the season with the Opening Cruising Division Party held on Friday, April 8th. We accomplished three significant things at the party.

- Next up will be digitizing the operations manuals and revising. We also are considering paint options for the cockpit on *Mr. Roberts*.

MARKETING – Karen Soule:

We will be following up with the 40+ non-member participants who attended the Weather for Sailors program AND the 34+ non-member who are currently enrolled in the Crew Training Seminar. Big outreach opportunities for new membership development.

Once the Event details are on the website, Karen Soule/Marketing will use the information to place a photo and details on the site's revolving photo carousel. Event chairs do not need to contact Karen for this-it will be done automatically once the Event page is established. Julie Ann Wash

- 2. Everyone is encouraged to post news on the website under "Post News". These postings are automatically swept-up and used in the membership E-Mail blast which is automatically sent Wednesdays at 9 AM. Please don't repost over any time-critical items if your news can wait a week.
- 3. Any events/news, especially those with potential to reach non-members, can be posted on Facebook. Please contact Karen/Marketing with those requests. These postings can be "boosted". Usual cost is \$25/regular boost. We can also post news/events in Women who Sail on the Chesapeake and Lower Chesapeake Sailing FB pages. These boosted efforts have helped attract potential new members to both the Weather for Sailors and Crew Training efforts. FBYC's summer intern will soon be developing FBYC's Instagram presence. IN MEMORIAM

Bryan Virgil Miller March 16, 1928 - April 24, 2022



Bryan Virgil Miller, husband of the late Myrtle Deagle Miller, died peacefully on April 24, 2022.

Virgil was preceded in death by his parents Baynard Wharton and Annie Bell Sibley Miller, and a grandson

Brandon Miller. He was the last surviving member of his family, having been predeceased by six siblings. Virgil was a lifelong member of Zoar Baptist Church.

He was born at Prospect near Locklies, VA on March 16, 1928. He graduated from Syringa High School and married his high school sweetheart, Myrtle, on October 12, 1946. He proudly served in the Coast Guard and often returned to Cape May, NJ in later years to visit lifelong friends. Myrtle and Virgil founded and operated Miller Marine Railway, Inc. where he was recognized throughout the industry as a master boatbuilder, a legacy that continues with his grandsons. Virgil was a founding member of the Deltaville Rescue Squad.

After retirement, Myrtle and Virgil cherished their time together for many years in the Florida Keys. They remained inseparable for 70 years, sharing the joys and sorrows of their personal



and business lives. Virgil spent his last years relaxing in his recliner at his home on Jackson Creek, watching baseball and spending time with his family. Virgil served as Club Manager of Fishing Bay Yacht Club

from 1993 – 2004. In 2003, he was elected to *Life Membership* in FBYC in recognition of service to the club for over 10 years.

Virgil is survived by his children Bryan Miller and his wife Debbie of Deltaville; his son Barry Miller; his son Bruce Miller and his wife Carolyn of Richmond; eight grandchildren, Bryan Allyn Miller (Jennifer), Ashley Miller Taliaferro (Mark), Braden Miller, Blake Miller (Courtney), Kaytlyn Miller Schleef (Ryan), Brent Miller, Brennen Miller and Elizabeth Ann Miller; seven greatgrandchildren, Baylen, Benton and Cayden Miller, Duncan and Luke Taliaferro, Kinsley Miller and Kara Schleef.
