THE COUNTDOWN IS ON TO OPENING DAY

As a club, we are all looking forward to one of the finest traditions at FBYC - Opening Day and Blessing of the Fleet on April 22nd! As I write this, we are 30 days away from the start of another season of great sailing and

memorable events with the most enthusiastic group of sailors on the Bay.

Projects abound and our many volunteer leaders are working with our intrepid staff to get the Club and all of its programs and facilities ready to go. We have the end in sight of a complete renovation of the electrical system on the West Dock and a well-planned and attended Spring Cleanup (followed by Evolution Sails' Sock Burning party) on March 25th. We were glad to have Middlesex Board of Supervisors member Lud Kimbrough in attendance, as we discussed ways the Club could continue to support Deltaville and the county going forward.

In preparation for this year's racing season, the Board has discussed and adopted a plan to ensure that competitors have reasonable insurance coverage as a prerequisite for participation. While this has been a standard practice at FBYC for our offshore Stingray Regatta, it is a growing requirement across the sport of sailing and is common at national regattas for both offshore and one-design competitors. This trend simply reflects the need to be prepared to make others whole in the event of an accident, in light of increasing costs to repair boats and especially people!

Fortunately, there are many other inexpensive ways to obtain the needed coverage and often such coverage is already in place via existing boat policies or even homeowners or renters policies. Please take a moment to read Mason Chapman's excellent article covering this topic in more depth.

PROTECTING YOURSELF AND OTHERS BY HAVING PROPER INSURANCE COVERAGE ON YOUR VESSEL By Mason Chapman

In recent years an increased number of regatta sponsors have added a requirement for sailors to have liability insurance coverage on their vessel in order to participate in the event. It started with large offshore regattas then made its way to large one-design regattas and is now common even for local yacht club events. At FBYC we have required it for offshore events for several years. This year the Board has adopted a requirement for all competing boats to have a minimum of \$300,000 of liability coverage. This applies to offshore, one-design and junior classes competing in both regattas and series races.

A very reasonable question to ask is Why? Why should the owner of a small one-design boat be required to buy \$300,000 of liability insurance coverage when the cost of a brand-new boat is less than \$15,000?

The Board believes that requiring all boats to have adequate insurance protects both the skipper who causes an accident and the sailor who is injured. Medical claims and litigation costs for seemingly minor injuries can add up quite quickly. An underinsured skipper may face grave financial consequences if he injures a fellow participant. Likewise, an injured party should not be left to pay for medical expenses from their own sources (savings or health insurance) because the person at fault does not have adequate insurance. Our research shows that \$300,000 is a fairly standard coverage level.

How does one get the required coverage?

There are a number of insurance companies that sell boat insurance. Many of the same companies that sell auto insurance also offer boat insurance. BoatUS/Geico is a popular choice. In some cases, liability coverage from Home Owners or Renter's Insurance may extend to your boat. We are not insurance experts by any means but we encourage you to talk to your insurance agent and to shop around. In most cases the price will be very reasonable.

Am I covered if I use an FBYC owned boat?

Yes! FBYC has extensive insurance policies designed specifically for yacht clubs. Our members, volunteers, staff and visitors are covered when using club boats.

How will FBYC enforce this requirement?

Our Notice of Race (NOR) documents for each of our events will state the requirement. Each time a skipper registers for an event on Regatta Network he will check a box stating that he has the required insurance. At this time we will not require sailors to submit evidence of insurance. We will rely on the good faith and sportsmanship of our competitors to follow the rules.

I have a confession to make. Despite the fact that I am a strong advocate of having insurance coverage for boats, when I sat down to write this article it occurred to me that I did not have coverage on my Melges 15. *Yikes!* I promptly called BoatUS Insurance (they cover my other boats) and in the short span of eleven (11) minutes I had purchased a policy with the required \$300,000 of liability coverage on this boat for a cost of seventy-seven dollars (\$77). It could not have been a more straightforward process. I saved a little money by getting liability only and by already having multiple policies on other boats, but the point is that the required coverage is easy to obtain and very reasonably priced.

If all sailors have adequate insurance coverage and are assured that their fellow competitors have the same we can all enjoy our time on the water even more. Thank you for your attention to this and please let me know if you have any questions. masontchapman@gmail.com

IN MEMORIAM Sherard Dixon "Dick" Cole, Jr.



February 20, 1939 - February 3, 2023



Sherard Dixon "Dick" Cole Jr, left on his next voyage on February 3rd at 3:47 am. His sons and devoted wife were there for his departure. Dick Cole loved his time at the boat and Fishing Bay Yacht Club. He caught the Sailing Virus in Evansville, Indiana, when he bought his first Sunfish in 1968. He took that love of sailing to Erie, Pennsylvania and Rome, Georgia, where he started a sail club on the nearest lake he could find. The Rome Sailing Club, while landlocked, became his passion, where he communed with his fellow sailors every weekend.

In 1993 he moved to Midlothian, and within a few months found Fishing Bay Yacht Club. By the late 1990's he had become a board member and in 2000 was elected to the Flag, which built our first-class clubhouse. Dick served as Commodore in 2003-2004. Throughout his life, he believed that sharing the sailing experience was the perfect time to spend with friends. Teaching the new sailors was his calling. He will certainly be missed.

Richard Victor "Rick" Palm died on February 28, 2023 at his home in Hardyville VA. His friends and family will remember him for his spirit of adventure and his dedication to "giving back" to those who shared his

passions. His passions were many but sailing across oceans and wood-working top the list. He believed strongly in experiential learning and seeks to leave his legacy to programs that encourage kids to learn with their hands.

His sailing adventures spanned over 50 years and took Rick and his wife Julie around the world, across the Atlantic twice, to and from the Caribbean a dozen times, and up and down the coast of North America from Nova Scotia to the Keys. He relished nothing more than helping coastal sailors prepare for their first offshore passages, both with the Caribbean 1500 and the Salty Dawg Sailing Association.

Dedication to family was a dominant part of Rick's life. While his parents died before he was in his 30's and he was an only child, he adopted Julie's family quickly, enjoying sailing trips with her father and raising Julie's son Ted (wife, Rebecca) as his own. Nothing pleased him more than watching his two grandsons Owen and Eli mature into young adults.
