GETTING READY FOR A GREAT SEASON

While we all are looking forward to Opening Day in April, the Club is well underway into a cycle of planning on projects to prepare for 2023 on and off the water! Every boat owner I know has their list of offseason projects and is taking

full advantage of the break to get ready.

We have a can't-miss Winter Program coming up on February 25th at the Westwood Club in Richmond. Come hear David and Allison Lennarz recount their experiences building and launching their new catamaran in South Africa and then undertaking a 6500 mile trans-Atlantic journey to the Caribbean!

We also have the annual launch of registration for our Junior Programs on February 1st. I highly encourage everyone to take advantage of the Club member preference period this year. Parker and Kim Garrett are already planning for another amazing activity-packed Junior season with our returning coaches.

On the Club projects side, we have a very active winter and spring ahead of us. We have been notified that the project to bury the electrical service on Stove Point will be underway any day now. This project and the water system installation were also major pre-conditions to any work commencing on the road improvements on Fishing Bay Road, so it is good to see them coming to fruition.

For our docks on Jackson Creek, on the heels of rebuilding our middle dock in 2022, the Board approved a project to also update the west dock's electrical service. The west dock is in excellent shape physically, but the decision was made to bring its aging electrical system up to the same level and configuration as our other docks. Mayo Tabb is leading this effort and we are anticipating that the project will not be finished until after Opening Day, primarily due to the continuing supply chain challenges of getting all the electrical components needed. Our facilities team has a communication plan for keeping all west dock slip holders in the loop and will be ready to help anyone who needs alternate arrangements during any downtime please see Mayo's article for more detail!

On the side of Club management, one of the key activities of the winter is reviewing our insurance policies and making sure that any changes we have had are properly reflected and covered. It is always recommended that everyone who participates in FBYC events or keeps a boat (offshore or one-design) at the Club should also take some time this year and review their coverage with their agent. Speaking from personal experience, my conversation last year with my agent was eye-opening! I learned that my existing coverages were likely not enough to cover a major claim and that my long time provider would not name FBYC as an additional insured, which is a requirement of our slip lease agreement. This process led me to switch providers and increase my coverage limits, as the costs to make both boats and injured parties whole has only increased in these past years. Please consider adding this important review to your yearly offseason todo list and enjoy a season knowing you are prepared for the worst.

Let's all continue to plan and prepare together for the coming sailing season! ~ Mark Wensell, Commodore

WEST DOCK ELECTRICAL UPDATE By Mayo Tabb, Dock Chair

The West Dock is having its 30-year-old electrical service redone and upgraded to be very similar to what we have on the East and Middle Floating Docks and to comply with latest Electrical Code. The primary Electrical Code change is the requirement for Ground Fault protection on all Dock circuits for safety. This will involve installing Power Pedestals, under dock waterproof cabling and Ground Fault Beakers in a waterproof panel at the dock head. The cuts slips on each side and hoist will also have Ground Fault breakers in this panel. The T-head Power Pedestal will have both 30-amp 125v and one 125/250v 50 amp receptacle for visiting Catamarans or power boats. Some of you may have seen the seven new Power Pedestals stored at the barn.

We are facing two critical paths on this project - tides and supply chain for Square D panels, disconnects and breakers. This has caused us to employ a twostage construction process. The first is installation of the supports and cables. The second stage will be the installation of conduits, cables, and panels at the dock's land side.

First, the under-dock installation of 22 cable supports by FBYC staff can only be done during periods of low tides which is planned for the week of January 22. The FBYC staff will install the Power Pedestals in an early February time frame. The plan is for the contractor to install the 7 under dock cables during the low tide period starting about February 20. An approximate one-foot square opening will be left at the top of the dock where the cable will be coiled around one of the pilings until needed later.

The supply situation for electrical components is extended at this time and delivery quotes are basically meaningless so you only can plan when you have the nearly two dozen Square D components in hand. The meaningless delivery quotes we have range from 2 to 6 months. Once the electrical contractor has the Square D components in hand, we will start Stage Two which will involve Dominion turning off the power and is expected to last 2 weeks to a month. My best estimate as to when this will occur is June. During that stage there are 6 distinct steps that involve removing the walking path in front of the electrical panel, removing existing electrical panel and conduits, rebuilding the wooden support, installing new conduits and Square D parts. This work all must be completed and inspected by Middlesex County before Dominion will reconnect the power. This work will occur during the weekdays and a temporary walking path over the removed section will be installed for personnel access during the weekends.

During Stage Two the Hoist will not be operational and any boats needing electricity to charge batteries will have to stop at the East T-head. If you have any questions, please call Mayo Tabb, Dock Chair at 804 690 3540.

CLUB LEASING AND STORAGE UPDATE

At the end of 2022, the Club's Trustees determined to make organizational changes to administer all leasing – wet slips, yard storage, lockers and racks by a single member in coordinated effort with the Club's General Manager and Executive Secretary. For those that don't know me, I'm Jim Raper, the Leasing Guy, and skipper of *Rhapsody*, an offshore racer on the East Dock.

While I am more familiar with the Jackson Creek slips having formerly been Docks chair, I am quickly coming up to speed on the other member leased club assets. The good news is that the grounds and buildings that support this activity are truly an asset of the club. We currently have designated spaces on the yard for 117 dry sailed boats, racks that will hold 85 Optis, dingys, kayaks and paddle boards, 36 barn and sail lockers and 77 wet slips on Jackson Creek. There is no waiting list for dry sailed yard storage, racks or lockers. The slips currently have a waiting list with 15 members on it. If you have interest, please contact me – jlraperjr@gmail.com.

Some changes are necessary in how yard storage is administered. A survey of the yard this past weekend demonstrated that there are many boats currently on the yard that are neither club owned nor on the roster of boats with active leases. We need to take steps to remedy this.

I want to communicate what's intended and the timeline to make it so.

Annually, beginning for the 2023 season, the Club will issue stickers to each member with an active lease for the following year. These stickers will be required to be affixed to the transom of yard stored boats prior to opening day...very similar to the registration sticker that you put on your license plate each year; but much better looking. Similarly, all club assets for Junior and Adult Sailing will have perpetual stickers for identification.

Shortly after opening day, boats on the yard without stickers will be identified and every attempt made

to communicate with the owner for the purposes of executing a current lease. If unsuccessful in locating the owner, the Club's General Manager will relocate the boat from the main yard and to the dry sail area near the lift on Jackson Creek while additional attempts are made to be in communication with the owner. Only as a last resort, the Club will begin appropriate disposal steps.

If you've got a boat on the yard and are not currently on a lease, the good news is, we've got room for you and are happy to continue to accommodate your boat. Please contact either me or Donna, the Club's executive secretary, to get the lease form and billing sorted out. If leasing a spot is not in your future, if you'd just drop me a line and I will work that into the plan.

I'm looking forward to 2023 at the Club...with over 300 convenient, safe, attended, affordable storage options for members in their pursuit of the sport of sailing; it will be a privilege to work with more of our members than I have in the past.
