# COMMODORE'S ADDRESS

As I began thinking about the topic for this month's newsletter, I received an email from Mark Hayes with a list of 41 sailors who have gone on to sail in college, emerging from our Junior Program, including some

current and past board members. His note reminded me of how important the Junior Program has been to our Club and the amount of value we have placed on it over the last decade.

The Junior Program has been an integral part of our Club since 1942 beginning with what was known as the Junior Seamanship Academy. What began as a small group of kids with parents passionate about sailing and teaching children to sail, has blossomed into a program that is known throughout the world. Today, we attract top coaches and world-class sailors from Argentina, Ecuador, Australia, Chile, and more. Today, we typically have 155 sailors at Junior Week, 46 Opti Kids participants and 15-20 race team members competing across the nation with a waiting list for many of our programs.

Over the years, a lot has changed at our Club, including the Junior Program. As the world changes, we have changed and adapted as a club, but one thing that we have always stayed true to since those early days is our mission: "the object shall be the development of the art and science of sailing, the acquisition of knowledge of the theory and practice of seamanship, navigation, meteorology, and allied subjects." This is something that we have stood by since the beginning and is still a key piece of our program.

As mentioned in my opening, we have had numerous college sailors emerge from our program, many of

whom still give back to our Club to this day. Some people that stood out on this list are members such as Rob Whittemore, Parker Garrett, Julie Chapman, Mike Toms, Blake Kimbrough, and Mary Katherine Buhl, who have all served in board roles for the Club over recent vears. Currently, we have 16 sailors that came out of our program competing at the collegiate level at schools across the country, including the U.S. Naval Academy, Merchant Marine Academy, SUNY Maritime, Dartmouth, Brown, Stanford, Boston, Bowdoin, American, South Carolina, University of Virginia, Virginia Tech, Christopher Newport & Old Dominion. I have had the opportunity to connect with many of our former sailors at college events and usually ask the same question to each: "What has been your best experience in sailing?" and they all reply, "Summers at Fishing Bay!" All the people named and many, many more have given back to the Club by serving as volunteers during Junior Week, coaching our ODT & race teams, or serving on race committees after learning to sail here and growing up in our Junior Program.

I would like to thank all the people who have supported the Junior Program over the years by volunteering their time and skills to teach our youth about sailing and for past leaders who recognized the importance of junior sailing. It was the junior program that first attracted Jennifer and me to the Club, and as our children have aged out of the programs, we have reflected on how lucky we were to become a part of this community and how big an influence the program has had on our children. It takes close to 100 volunteers to support our Junior Week program, and I can tell you from personal experience that it is one of the most rewarding experiences you can have as you see kids away from their devices and developing a love for the sport of sailing. ## Jeanne Hamilton

March 28, 1939 - December 14, 2023





Jeanne Bounds Hamilton, 84, of New York, New York passed away unexpectedly on December 14, 2023 at Lenox Hill Hospital in New York surrounded by her family.

Jeanne was born on March 28, 1939 to Paul and Jean Bounds in Richmond, Virginia. After graduating Phi Betta Kappa in Math from Sweet Briar College she moved to New York City to work as a systems engineer for IBM. In New York, she met and fell in love with D. Ross Hamilton and they were married on July 11, 1964 at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church. As an only child, Jeanne always wanted to raise a large family. Her dream was fulfilled with four children that gave her ten grandchildren, a source of great joy.

Jeanne approached life with indomitable energy, passion and positivity. She greeted everyone with an open mind, joy and curiosity, which led to lasting friendships in New York, Maryland, Virginia, and wherever she spent time.
