# Sunday, June 2, FBYC Clubhouse 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, 12-2 pm

Have you ever wanted to be part of the Race Committee but did not know how/where the onramp was to get involved? As a racer, have you ever been puzzled by a Race Committee decision on the course and wondered why they did what they did? Have you ever wondered how races were set up, executed, or what all those people on the Signal Boat and Mark boats were up to?

Now is your chance to find answers to these questions as the Race Management Team will offer a "Race Committee 101"

The learning goal of this basic workshop is to familiarize participants with the roles and responsibilities of all people on the Race Committee boats before, during and after the race. The workshop will also include a visit to the Race Committee Shed so you see where all the tools for racing are kept. Experienced volunteers will be on hand to add value and answer your questions.

Attendees' names will be sent to 2024 Principle Race Officers (PRO) to get you on a boat and apply what you learned. PRO's are encouraged to send members of their Race Committee teams to deepen their basic knowledge before getting out on the water, or attend in person to find new recruits for your RC team!

## PROCEDURES FOR DRIVING FBYC RACE COMMITTEE BOAT, AKA "MR. ROBERTS"

Are you a new PRO who can't wait to volunteer for your first race? Or have you not driven *Mr. Roberts* in a while, and could use a little refresher? You can enhance your PRO skills by being checked out to drive *Mr. Roberts*.

Prior to driving *Mr. Roberts* please complete training and a check ride with David Clark. David will help you get familiar with the various systems on the boat, especially anchoring and working with the windlass. Each check ride will ideally require three people on the boat to best simulate the race committee environment.

Mr. Roberts is critical to every aspect of the racing we do at FBYC and proper training will help lessen the chances of damage to the boat or people on the water. 


