Unfortunately, there is quite a backlog at the prop factory, but they are using their leverage to expedite the process. I also want to note that the prop was not installed

or touched by Norton's; whatever caused it to fall off was not due to their work.

Enough about me! Last month, I spent too much time discussing my dilemma and didn't highlight all the awesome things that happened at FBYC during August. This is one of our busiest months, as we hosted nine sailing events, including the Jere Dennison Memorial Regatta, an Adult Sailing Instruction Day, Wee Dram, and of course, the Labor Day Weekend Stingray Regatta. Each event was a success, and I can't thank the countless volunteers enough for pulling everything together in such a short time.

The Jere Dennison Memorial Regatta was held on August 3rd, named after long-time club member and former Commodore Jere Dennison. This special event is a one-day regatta for skippers over the age of 60 who sail classic and one-design boats. This year, we had 20 participants. Phil Webb served as the event chair, Jere's son Clark was the race chair, and Susan Webb handled all of the social activities. Next, we had a fantastic Adult Sailing Instruction Day on August 17th, with 18 adult students learning about one-design sailing. I'm amazed at how this program has flourished under the leadership of Ron Jenkins and Joe Roos. Special thanks to Event Chair Ron Jenkins, Race

Chair Holly Sears, and Social Chair Robin Rutsky for making this event such a success.

The next major event was the Wee Dram, held from August 23rd to 25th. As a cruiser, this is my favorite event of the year and a signature Cruising Division event. As you know from last month's article, I was unable to take Traveller II (the Admiral was less than thrilled). Fortunately, Mason Chapman stepped up and invited a few of us, including the Wensell family, Mary Almany (Paul was otherwise occupied), and Anne Litt, on a day trip to Cape Charles aboard River Rat. Please don't read anything into the fact that the flag officers joined a sailing event via powerboat; we all love sailing. CALL FOR THE 2024 AWARD NOMINATIONS

The Trophy Committee will receive nominations until October 11th for the following perpetual trophies to be awarded for this year's Annual Awards:

COMPETITION TROPHY

Presented in 1982 by former Commodore Beverley L. Crump, this is a perpetual award to recognize the skipper or skippers (who must be members of FBYC) of a yacht or yachts enrolled in the Club Register, who have most successfully represented FBYC in sailboat racing events conducted by other yacht clubs or associations during the past year. Such events may be either one-design or offshore and specifically shall include Chesapeake Bay events, and events with area, regional, national and international competition. This trophy is intended to recognize the unusual and outstanding efforts by FBYC members, the character of the event or events entered. the quality of the competition, the extent of the effort involved for the FBYC member and the participation of all Club members shall be considered as well as the member's performance of such event or events.

COMMODORES BOWL

The Commodores Bowl shall be awarded to the skipper, who is a member of Fishing Bay Yacht Club, for their outstanding achievements in the world of sailing which includes racing, endurance events and accomplishments in voyaging. Selection for this award should consider the quality of events, the rarity of the achievement, and performance in FBYC and non-FBYC events. The selection of the recipient of this trophy shall be determined by the Commodore. The Commodore may appoint a committee to determine the winner of the trophy.

PIANKATANK TROPHY

Recognizes the FBYC skipper who most exemplifies the principle that "all is not lost until the boat sinks."

MATTHEW FONTAINE MAURY BOWL

Recognizes a member of FBYC for an outstanding contribution to sailing at Fishing Bay Yacht Club.

ALLEN B. FINE TROPHY

Recognizes the outstanding crewperson of an FBYC enrolled yacht. Any skipper who is a Club member may nominate anyone who has crewed on a FBYC boat (offshore or one-design) during the regular Club season.

THE HUBARD TROPHY

Awarded to the outstanding female sailor of FBYC in recognition of dedication, participation, and performance and sportsmanship while sailing.

SPORTSMANSHIP TROPHY

Recognizes the Offshore Division skipper who displays the best sportsmanship during the regular season.

WAYLAND W. RENNIE CRUISING AWARD

Presented in 1997 by the Cruising Division as a perpetual trophy to be awarded annually to the Fishing Bay Yacht Club member for support of the Cruising Division and for cruising the Chesapeake Bay with a sense of adventure in comradeship with fellow sailors.

ANNUAL RACE COMMITTEE TROPHY

Awarded to the Club member who has made the greatest contribution to race committee work and race management at FBYC.

BECCA BOAT TROPHY

Awarded to the FBYC junior female member who best exemplifies Becca Clary's devotion to FBYC.


