

THE COMMODORE'S ADDRESS



GRATEFUL

Our Offshore Fall Open Regatta and Dock Mixer were perfect examples of these beautiful conditions on October 18 and 19. This is a good time to be intentional about being thankful for what we have at FBYC, and planning for our upcoming year.

I spent some time on the race committee for the Offshore Fall Open, and it always reminds me what great volunteers we have, and how much pre-planning goes into making these events happen. I'm thankful for the race committee and mark boat volunteers. These folks could be doing anything else. They could be sailing, or just doing whatever they want with their weekend. But they don't see it that way - our race committees are out on the water because they see


boat, and a touching tribute to Allan Heyward was given by those who knew him best.










IN MEMORIAM Allan McAlpin Heyward April 16, 1950 - October 12, 2025



All FBYC teams sailed exceptionally well against top national competition. Teddy Bower and Clarke Garrett followed closely with an 11^{th} overall finish and 2^{nd} in the Youth Division, while Cyrus Garrett and John Hubbard secured 8^{th} in the Youth Division.

Two hurricanes passing offshore earlier in the week threatened to disrupt the 44th Chesapeake Bay ILCA Masters Championship, but both storms turned north just in time to leave Fishing Bay Yacht Club with a picture-perfect fall weekend- clear skies, mild temperatures, and no sign of tropical weather. Unfortunately, the storms also took the wind with them, leaving sailors to contend with light air both days.

This year's event introduced separate starts for ILCA 6 and ILCA 7 fleets, drawing 41 competitors from across the region. After some last-minute class changes prompted by the forecast, the final tally was 27 ILCA 7s and 14 ILCA 6s.

Friday was devoted to arrivals, setup, and practice sails, with many sailors pitching tents and settling in for the weekend. In the galley, Alain Vincey, Michel Jaland, and John Gilmore worked together to prepare Saturday evening's dinner - a highlight of the event for many returning competitors.

Saturday dawned calm, with glassy water across Fishing Bay. The race committee quickly hoisted the postponement flag ashore and waited for signs of breeze. Forecast models hinted at a late-day window, so the committee prepared to race as late as daylight would allow, checking navigation lights and timing dinner service around potential race returns.

By early afternoon, the wind began to fill, first from the west, then swinging south and finally settling in from the east around 4-6 knots. At 1:30 p.m., the AP flag came down, and by 2:30, the first races were underway just west of Stove Point in the Piankatank River.

The ILCA 7 fleet started first, sailing a short one-lap race. Defending champion Dave Chapin opened strong with a win, followed by Rob Whittemore (Fishing Bay Yacht Club) in second and James Jacob (Severn Sailing Association) in third.

In the ILCA 6s, Deniz Cirivello (Severn Sailing Association) took the first bullet ahead of Keith Barron (Ocala Sailing Club) and Jeff Moore (Severn Sailing Association).

A longer second race followed as the breeze held. Alex Jacob led the ILCA 7s wire-to-wire with Chapin and Mark Sanford (Marsh Creek Sailing Club) close behind. In the ILCA 6s, Bill Lawson (SSA) claimed the win, with Cirivello second and Moore again in third.

As the sun dipped lower and wind began to soften, the race committee opted for one final one-lap race before calling it a day. This time, Rob Whittemore took the win in the ILCA 7s, followed by Sanford and Chapin. Cirivello closed out a strong day by winning again in the ILCA 6s, ahead of Lawson and Natalie Burls (Severn Sailing Association). Racing wrapped up around 4:30 p.m., and boats were ashore by 5, just in time for the evening meal.

Saturday's dinner was a team effort, highlighted by a story from Alain about his longtime friend Michel Jaland, who first introduced him to sailing years ago when the two were chefs in Bermuda.

Sunday brought the calm conditions everyone feared. After several hours of waiting and watching for the faintest sign of breeze, the race committee called it a day, and the regatta concluded with awards ashore.

A huge thanks goes to PRO Rick Klein and his dedicated team of volunteers for their patience and skill in making the most of a challenging forecast- and to all the sailors who kept the Chesapeake Bay ILCA Masters tradition alive for another year.

Despite the light wind, the weekend delivered what the ILCA Masters are best known for - good company, good food, and good sailing when the wind cooperates.
